PASSED BOGUS CHECKS

MONCTON, August 15—A young man named George A. Carter, or McDonald, was in town last week and succeeded in working off at least two checks that are apparently worthless. Buying a small quantity of tobacco at Armstrong and McFarlane's stand in City Market on Saturday, he tendered a cheque for \$6.60 drawn by C.S. McLeod, at Amherst, and got the change. The same day he tendered a similar cheque for \$6.75 at Wetmore's lunch car and also got the change. The cheques were sent to Amherst, but returned with the information that no such person as McLeod was known there. It has been learned that a similar game was worked in Amherst, where a cheque for ten dollars, purporting to be drawn by C. S. McLeod, of Halifax, in favor of George McDonald, was successfully negotiated.

It is believed Carter and McDonald are one and the same. The police of Halifax and St. John have been notified in the hope that Carter or McDonald may be located.

TROUBLE OVER MONGOLIA.

PEKIN, Aug. 15—A prominent and patriotic Mongolian prince, leader of the Mongolian alliance, an organization of several thousands Mongolians has planned an expedition to Mongolia to be accompanied by Chinese troops for the purpose of overcoming the independence movement which is the basis of Russian demands that China grant Mongolian autonomy and that steps be taken to bring about the partition of Mongolia.

Russia now objects, declaring she will not permit China to send soldiers to Mongolia, on account of the infringing of Russian special interests which it would entail. The Chinese government is helpless and has decided to accede to the Russian demands, thus practically running the chances of success of the expedition.

DORCHESTER MEN SIGNED.

SYDNEY, August 14—The manager of the Reserve ball team in the county league, says that he has secured the services of some of the Dorchester players, now engaged in a series with Halifax teams. The men signed on are Warwick, Hines, Wakefield, Daly and Riley. They will be with Reserve when that team meets New Waterford next week.

BRITISH OFFICER.

OTTAWA, Aug. 15—What Canadians do ought to be in addition to our own naval programme" asserted Rear Admiral Tate, Supt. of the British Naval Dockyard at Portsmouth, who arrived in the city this evening. Further than this he would not comment on naval matters. "I will say though," he added "that the Canadian Minister's visit was a huge success and should be fraught with most far reaching results towards the strengthening of the British Empire." Rear Admiral Tate has been superintendent in Portsmouth for the past two years.

NO FURTHER PROTESTS.

WASHINGTON, August 15—It is said to be reasonably certain that no further protest will be made by Great Britain on behalf of British mercantile interests against the Panama canal bill if it finally takes the form reported yesterday from the conference committee. The British objection was laid against discrimination against British shipping. As such shipping is not now privileged to enter into the American canalway trade which alone is to receive favored treatment in the canal, that objection is overcome. It is regarded as possible, however, in deference to Canada, the British government may be led to object to the prohibition against the passage of railroad ownership, but state department officials are confident that object would not hold under the treaty as the prohibition is to apply to American vessels as well as others, and there could be no charge of discrimination there.

PENSION FOR DAUGHTER OF JUSTIN MCCARTHY.

LONDON, Aug. 16—The British Government has granted a pension of \$350 yearly to the daughter of the late Justin McCarthy, novelist and historian, whose estate was only \$2300.

MUST TEACH ENGLISH.

TORONTO, Aug. 15—Hon. Mr. Pyne, Minister of Education has announced that no teacher shall be granted a certificate to teach in English-French schools who does not possess the knowledge of the English language sufficient to teach the public school course. Educationists declare that the department's desire to secure proficient teachers for the bilingual schools is responsible for the caution of the Department in establishing another French-English training school and locating it at Vanveek Hill. English-French schools not having qualified teachers shall receive no grants. On due application from the school officials, inspectors, and French-English schools which is unable to provide and on a report of all the directors the salaries necessary to secure a qualified teacher shall receive a special grant.

119 FISHERMEN LOST

BILBAO, Spain, August 15—One hundred and nineteen Spanish fishermen belonging to this port, lost their lives by the sinking of fourteen fishing boats during a terrible storm which has raged along the Spanish coast during the past two days. The hurricane, which has now abated, caused immense havoc in the coast towns.

ESSENCE OF MUMMY.

Queer medicine that was used Not So Long Ago In Persia. In former times strange products were used as medicines. Among them was essence of mummy, which held a place in the pharmacopoeia even during the last century.

Two sorts of mummies were used for the production of the extract—the true and the artificial. True mummies were disinterred from the valley of the Nile and forwarded to Europe and Asia by the Arabs. Their therapeutic virtues were attributed to substances used by their embalmers. The saving of curative principles of those substances were supposed to have been preserved and held intact by the swathing bands used with secret and peculiar art to wrap the dead. Essence of mummy was recommended in cases of convulsions, as a cure for boils, in epilepsy, colds, etc.

In Persia, embalming was once the habit. The shabs offered mummies, or portions of mummies, as gifts to the monarchs whose friendship they respected, and chroniclers record the fact as worthy of historical note that Louis XIV. and Catherine of Russia received, among numerous gifts of various sorts, golden chests containing mummified human members. In 1890, when Princess Charlotte of England was sick, her doctors administered "essence of mummy."

A manuscript recently found, the production of the Persian poet Nizam, gives the formula for producing the synthetic mummy. According to that prescription, the man selected was of slender flesh and fine, thin skin—a man whose chief nourishment had been fruit. At the age of thirty years his throat was cut and his body, while still warm with life, was placed in a stone urn filled, save for the space required for it, with honey and with balsamic substances. The full urn was sealed and set away to ripen. At the close of a period varying from fifty to a hundred years the body, completely mummified, was taken out and the extraction of the "essence" was made.

A Man With an Appetite.

Nicholas Wood was a Kentish gentleman who gormandized his way to fame in the seventeenth century. This worthy "would eat a whole hog at a sitting and follow it up next day with thirty dozen pigeons." Wood was an appetite not to be laughed at, and so when some slight was put upon it by Taylor, the water poet, Wood challenged the poet to a bout at "eating as much black pudding as would reach across the Thames at any place fixed by Taylor himself between London and Richmond." The Thames at London Bridge is about 300 yards across, and black pudding is compounded in links the same as sausage, so it's easy to figure Wood's gross tonnage.

A Deep Sleep.

Two well-known Paris dramatists were present at the Comedie Francaise at a performance of a play by one of them, who may be called A. Half way through the play A's friend B pointed to a spectator in a box who was fast asleep. The next evening A. and B. were again at the Comedie Francaise. One of B's plays was on the bill this time, and A. saw a spectator asleep and pointed him out to his friend. "Aly plays are not the only sleepy ones, you see," he said. "Look over there!" "Oh, I don't know!" said B. "I'm nearly sure it's the same box, and I believe it's the same man. He hasn't managed to wake up yet, that's all."

World's Oldest Investment.

The oldest investment security on earth is the real estate mortgage. We know that money was loaned on mortgages in ancient Babylon in the time of King Hamurabi, 4,000 years ago, and that some 2,500 years ago the great Babylonian banking house of the Egibi family invested large sums in mortgages on both city and farm property, the mortgages being recorded on bricks, which have been preserved in the safety deposit vaults of those times—great earthenware jars buried in the earth—preserved until the archaeologists in our own day and age dug them up to show us when, where and how mortgages originated.

EXPLORERS RETURNING.

DAWSON, Yukon Territory, August 15—Two men who arrived from the mouth of the MacKenzie river by trail yesterday, reported that Dlhman Stefansson and Dr. R. M. Anderson, of Iowa, who have been in the Arctic region more than four years for the American museum of natural history, making ethnological studies, have embarked on a whaling vessel for Seattle, going by way of Point Barrow. It is presumed that the explorers will land at Nome or some other Alaskan port, and take a steamer for the remainder of the voyage. The explorers left New York city in April, 1908, for Hudson Bay, and nothing was heard from them until September 1, 1911, when a letter was received in New York saying they would return in 1912, with complete surveys of Langdon Bay, Horton River and several other uncharted regions on the south coast of Victoria Land. Stefansson found a race of blonde eskimos.

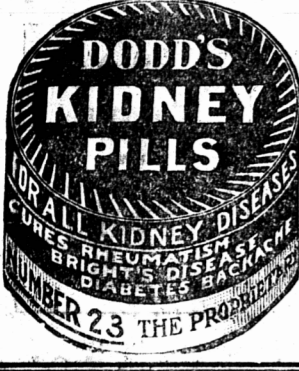
