PRIZE WINNING POULTRY.—In the "P. E. I. Annual Egg Laying Contest," as the largest revenue for the month of April, 1919 the class 1 Ribbon was won by Mr. F. W. E. Haslam, of Springfield, with his Australian white Leghorn Penicill birds laying a total of 160 eggs.

FRESH FISH.—The season's first big showing of fresh codfish was to be seen in the market yesterday. Big hauls have been taken at Grand Tracadie, Mr. Alex Walts of that place having on sale specimens of cod which weighed as much as fifty pounds. The cod were retailing from 10c per pound. There was also a fair showing of fresh herring, selling at 20c per dozen.
