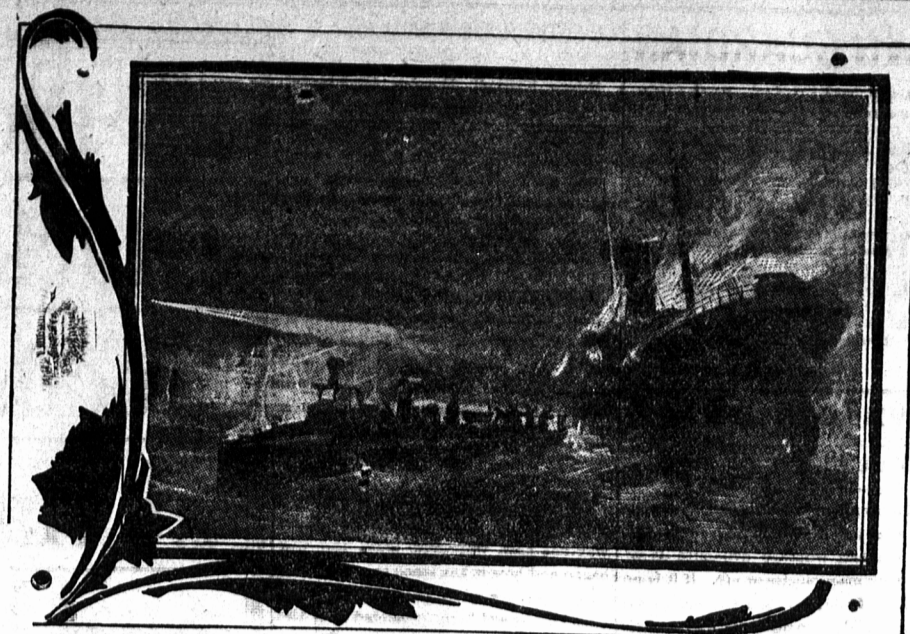

THE TUNNEL.
SIR:—I was surprised to read the editorial in The Patriot the other evening on the Tunnel Scheme. The Patriot gives us to understand the Tunnel would be no good this winter because of the snow blockade. I want to ask The Patriot how the 200 cars of freight got to Pictou and the 40 or 50 cars of freight to Georgetown. I want to tell The Patriot if we had a Railway Ferry or a Tunnel at the Capes this winter there would be little or no freight now at Pictou or Georgetown. The 250 cars of freight now hung up would have reached its destination the same day and it reached Pictou on the following day, the cattle throughout the Province now perishing for want of hay would be supplied with plenty, and the \$7,000,000 worth of smelts, now a total loss, would be scattered among the fishermen of P. E. Island, not to speak of the terrible loss to the province in other ways. Is it not high time some one took an interest in the shipping trade of this Province so that this great loss which must effect the whole Province this year, may not happen again.

EASTERN NOTES.

Feb. 27th.
The annual meeting of the Red Point Cheese Factory took place on the 14th inst. The attendance was smaller than usual on account of unfavorable roads and weather. The results of last year's operations were not so favorable as usual on account of conditions too well known over the Island, and which every cheese factory on it felt, yet a hopeful spirit pervaded the meeting and a determination to persevere in methods essential to success. The old staff of directors were unanimously re-appointed.

The death of Mrs. Daniel Gillis took place at North River on the morning of 26th inst. She was a daughter of the late Angus McDonald (Rutland) and leaves a disconsolate husband and two sons, one of them Louis in Gloucester, George at home and four sisters, two of them in California.

Theodore Fraser has opened a fish cutting establishment on premises temporarily secured from A. W. Bruce. The severity of the winter is making itself felt, intense frosts, furious gales and severe snow storms following each other in rapid succession. Men are getting disheartened shovelling snow day after day, to find the trenches they cut, filled up almost immediately. Shortage of wood is one of the troubles, and too many have experienced the task of shovelling a road to the woods to find it next day the same as when they began. No mails, no news from the outside world nor from the Island, except for a few miles away for nearly three weeks is an experience never known here before and gives us a taste of life in the Magdalen Islands during the winter season.

Considerable sickness still prevails. There is no improvement in the condition of William Young.

March 3rd.
If some of the feather-bed navigators who are going to navigate our straits all winter with the present steamers, or with any steamers that ever can be built, no matter how large or how powerful, would come east and see the quality and quantity of ice with which this section is surrounded they would quickly change their opinion.

March is here and fortunately the weather is a little milder, people are beginning to move once more, many of them towards the woods, shovelling their way, and after they get there, they have to contend with four and a half feet of snow, the most ever known by that oft-quoted person—the oldest inhabitant. Shade trees and rails saved many from freezing during the stormy weather.

The remains of James McPhee, Souris Cove, were buried at the Baptist burying ground Kingsboro on Sunday 26th ult.

The marriage of Mrs. Jessie Cummings (late of Lowell Mass., to James Mellick, was solemnized at the parsonage by Rev. Mr. Gardiner on the evening of the 28th ult. After the ceremony the happy couple drove to their future home, Elmira.

Sylvanus Sutherland and Augustus Foley have arrived home from the lumber woods of Maine. They report a hard trip and little for it, some three months work, pay their way there and back, and twenty three days coming home, a large part of it walked through the snows of this winter.

The Guardian regrets to learn that Rev. Mr. Gardiner is confined to the house through illness. He was unable to preach last Sunday, but hopes soon to fill his pulpit with his accustomed vigor. In his absence William Ford conducted the services assisted by Alex Scott, Jr.
