AUSTRIA ENTERS FIELD

To Outfit Expedition for Antarctic Exploration

PORTLAND, Oct. 1. (Special)—An Austrian Antarctic expedition for work from Weddell Sea south on the Antarctic is being prepared by a committee headed by Prof. Eugene Oberhummer, of Vienna, president of the Imperial Austrian Geographical Society. This information was received by Rear-Admiral Peary just before his departure for his winter residence in Washington, in a letter from Prof. Oberhummer.

Dr. F. Koenig, who was a member of a recent German expedition to the Antarctic and has had experience in Greenland is to be the leader. The Deutschland, used by Filchner's German expedition, has been acquired and is now at Trieste. The expedition will use dogs, and the type of sledge which Peary used in reaching the North Pole.

Admiral Peary said that in his opinion Prof. Oberhummer's ability and forceful personality at the head of the committee and the use of dogs by the expedition are factors that will work strongly for success.

"Austria is to be congratulated," he added, "on entering the Antarctic arena. It is possible that Austria may duplicate in the Antarctic the brilliant success of Weyprecht and Paye, who, forty years ago, discovered in those regions the unknown and entirely unsuspected archipelago of Franz Joseph Land."

ARGENTINE BEEF

Chemists Say it is of High Standard

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 1. (Special)—All beef so far imported from Argentina has had the stamp of approval of the government chemists. Tests at the New York Laboratory of the Bureau of Chemistry showed the meat to be of a high standard. Reports to this effect have been received by the Bureau of Chemistry here, L. M. Tolman, chief of the Food Inspection Laboratory, said tonight.

The Argentine beef is frozen for the long shipment and therefore seems different to the consumer from American beef, which is merely chilled. Officials of the Meat Inspection Service, anticipating great importations when the new tariff bill places the product on the free list, are preparing to revise the regulations for receiving it. These rules will be drawn to safeguard the public against diseased meat or meat that has spoiled in transit.

When meat goes on the free list there will be great shipments from South America. Meat Service chiefs believe. This will make additional work at the various ports, and it is probable that additional inspectors will be detailed to the stations.
