PARIS, Sept. 8.—Renewed and particularly violent attacks were made by the Germans on the Somme front last night, in an effort to regain ground won by the French.

The German attacks were made in strong force on the front between Bern and Chaumes, south of the Somme. The fighting was especially heavy between Vermandovilles and Chaumes.

Horror and Glories of Artillery War—France Supreme in Air—Russian's Description

Vasil Nemirovitch-Danchenko, a veteran Russian newspaper man, sends the following description of the battle for Verdun to his paper in Petrograd.

Verdun is empty. Part of this beautiful old town is in ruins. The yawning corners of the houses are just black holes.

Verdun is honeycombed with subterranean galleries, and no Boche gun can destroy them. In the galleries electricity burns and incessant work proceeds.

NERVY FRENCH OFFICER

Boldness and Resource Through Long Period Gave Him Freedom

French journals print a remarkable account of a French officer who succeeded in escaping, after being severely wounded, from captivity in Germany.

He escaped one dark night and, passing as a Belgian refugee, got rough farm work, and in return bought food and board.

In March, 1915, nearly cured, the officer determined to get back to France. For this a passport was necessary, but obviously impossible to get.

He was released at once, and on his return to Paris was able to give valuable information to the military authorities.
