CHURCH OF CHRIST

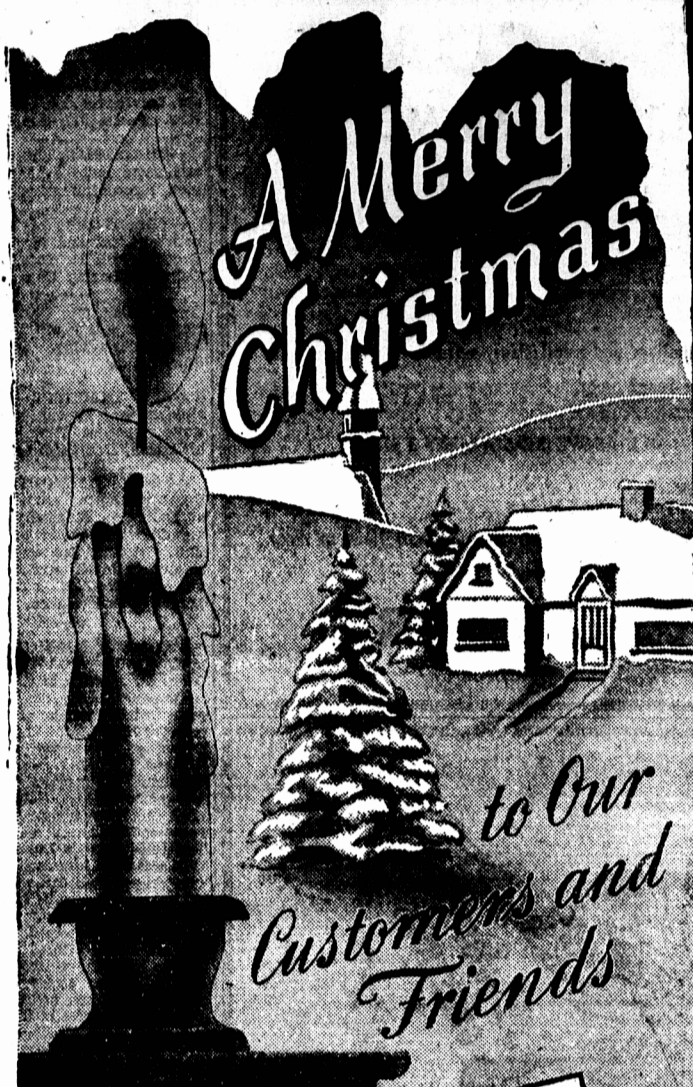
