Committee Finds Serious Soil Depletion Problem

Serious problems caused by the decline in crop producing ability of the soils of Prince Edward Island are dealt with in a comprehensive report of the Soils and Crops Committee appointed at the recent joint meetings of Dominion and Provincial agricultural officials, and released for publication yesterday.

Reforestation In view of the rapid depletion of home woodlots, the committee urges that the Prince Edward Island Government secure the services of a qualified forester in the Department of Agriculture to offer leadership and assistance to the farmers of the Province.

Manure and Fertilizers Regular applications of manure and ground limestone are made to our soils to help correct any unbalance of respective plant requirements are strongly recommended.

It is urged that legislation be enacted regulating the sale of pit-props, pulp wood and other immature types of trees from our limited forest reserves.
