PASTOR RUSSELL

Charles Taze Russell, known to the public as "Pastor" Russell, the preacher of Millennial Dawn, is dead, or, as he would have insisted, "fallen on sleep." It is said that 5,000 persons attended his funeral and that he will be mourned in 1,200 companies of his followers. His career is remarkable. Born in Pittsburgh sixty-four years ago, and brought up in his father's business, haberdashery, he set himself up as an interpreter of biblical Prophecy. His tracts and books were published under the name, Zion's Watch Tower, in Allegheny. Later he removed to Brooklyn, N. Y., where he established "The Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society," which floods the land with tracts and colporteurs. His followers are styled "The International Bible Students' Association." They have been drawn from many churches, probably from our own most of all. Their leader, who made the highest claims to scholarship, lacked even a college education. Though he used the title of "pastor" he was never ordained by any religious body. He is said to have accumulated a fortune in the peculiar business in which he was engaged; namely, relieving people of their uncomfortable beliefs regarding the future life.
