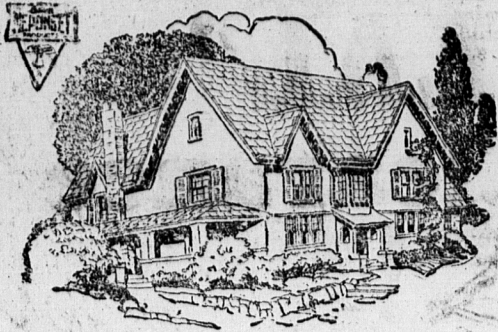

Twenty-five thousand persons are expected to attend.

AUSTRIAN ROYAL PLATE TO BE PLACED ON SALE

VIENNA, July 15.—What is probably the largest and most valuable collection of silver plate in Europe, the famous silver treasure of the Cumberland family, is reported to be coming into the market. It was kept in the Cumberland royal villa at Penzance just outside Vienna, until the death of the old King of Hanover in 1878. Afterwards it was removed to the Cumberland country seat at Gmunden in Salzka. The collection includes priceless specimens of the work of silversmiths in England, Augsburg, Hanover and during the three centuries 1569 and 1850, the only one which approaches it in completeness is that in the castle. The total weight of the treasure is 15 to 120,000 ounces its value in Austria having amounted to several hundred yards. But it is understood that purchaser or purchasers, will to pay in some foreign currency, normal exchange and not in Austrian crowns.
