

CONSERVATIVE PLATFORM

1. An immediate and complete investigation in order to ascertain and reveal the true condition of the finances of the Province.
2. An immediate halt to the reckless debt increases of the last four years.
3. Abolition of the present pernicious system of appointing members of the Legislature to salaried Public Offices, in order to return to sound principles of responsible Government and to effect major economies.
4. Restoration to the citizens of their right of resort to the Courts of Justice of which they have been deprived by the Campbell Government.
5. The adaptation of our Educational System to the present actual needs of our Province including Youth Training; Encouragement of Credit Unions, co-operative Associations and other forms of Adult Education and Investigation into the high price of school books with the view of lessening the cost and adoption of a plan to prevent the frequent changes in text books.
6. A Policy of farm rehabilitation aimed primarily at placing practical young farmers upon farms at the lowest possible rate of interest.
7. Support of the dairying, hog raising and other branches of mixed farming and a Practical Policy of soil analysis in co-operation with the Federal Department of Agriculture, with a view of determining the fertilizer requirements of the land.
8. Continuation of the fight for lower freight rates on farm products and the extension of the policy of freight rates assistance on ground line throughout the entire year and also assistance to farmers in the purchase of lime.
9. A New Road Act will be introduced using the school district as a unit; greater attention to the repair and upkeep of the ordinary roads of the Province and a return to our policy of using local pit and shore gravel; a proper system of maintenance, conservation and drainage of hard surfaced roads; further extension of hard surfaced roads and gravelled roads as the finances of the Province warrant.
10. Continued Public Health Activity and assistance in establishing young physicians in country districts where there is no resident physician.
11. Fishermen's Relief will be given where necessary under proper supervision; Fishermen's Loans will be put on a proper business basis. A real effort will be made to secure better markets for fish. Investigation into the possibility of establishing plants for the manufacture of fish meal and other fish products.
12. Having in 1935 established our claims against the Dominion Government to the extent of three million dollars, giving this Province an increased subsidy of \$150,000 annually, we will continue to press for a full realization of our claims on the basis of the minority report of the White Commission.

Canadian Warships Enroute To Meet Royal Flotilla

HALIFAX, May 11—(CP)—Harbingers of Canada's welcome to the King and Queen, two destroyers steamed down Halifax harbor early tonight to meet the liner bearing the royal visitors on their way to the Dominion.

The grey-hulled Saguenay and Skeena were to hail the liner Empress of Australia tomorrow night near rockbound St. Paul's Island, off the northeast tip of Nova Scotia, if the weather held good. Otherwise, the rendezvous was to be off Quebec's Gaspé Peninsula for Saturday morning.

Since weather forecasts received by naval authorities pointed to fog and generally bad weather over the Gulf of St. Lawrence Friday night, it was considered likely the destroyers would not pick up the Royal Flotilla until Saturday.

The Canadian craft headed down the long reaches of Halifax Harbor tonight at a smart 15-knot speed. As they slipped through the calm water, sparkle under the bright rays of the lowering sun, the whistles and sirens of waterfront craft gave them a rousing send-off.

They were to head eastward along the south shore of the Province for the meeting, carrying a group of newspapermen and Canadian Broadcasting Corporation men who will describe the meeting of the Canadian and British ships.
