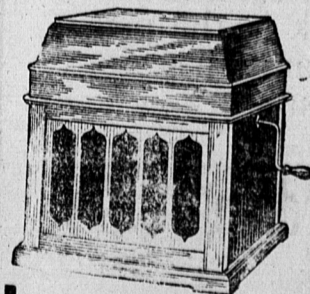

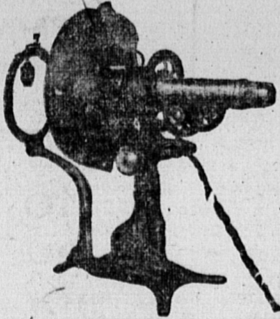
MISS MARY E. BEARS

FRENCH EFFORT FOR INTERNATIONAL ARMY WITHDRAWAL

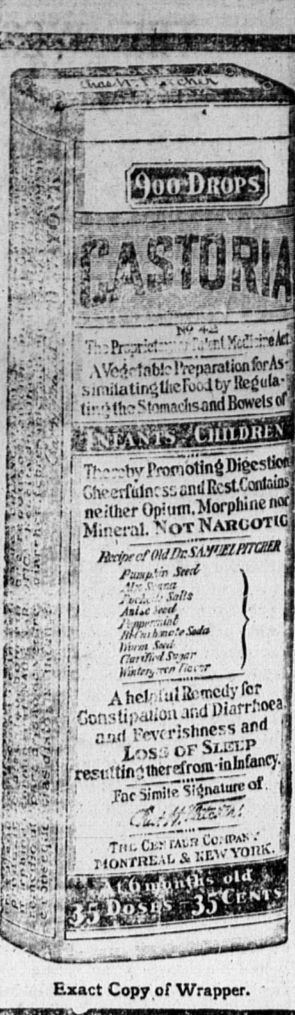

PARIS, Feb. 15.—President Wilson will sail from Trier today carrying the constitution of the League of Nations approved unanimously by the League commission and by the peace conference as a whole. At the final session of the Commission, with President Wilson absent he was attending the war council, the French made a last effort to obtain the adoption of their proposal for an international army. When the question was put to a vote the Czechoslovak delegate was the only member who supported the French. The French withdrew the proposal and a unanimous agreement was reached.
