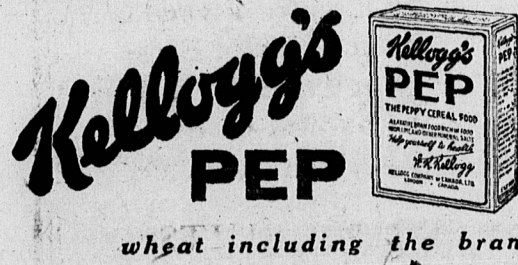

### The Rush-Bagot Treaty

Q. What was the Rush-Bagot Treaty?  
A. The Rush-Bagot Treaty brought to an end the war of 1812-14 between England and the United States. It was so called because executed by Sir Charles Bagot, as representing the British Government and Richard Rush the United States. President John Monroe signed; as well as John Quincy Adams as the U. S. Secretary of State in 1818. The treaty was signed in a building in Brussels, which still stands, and where a tablet marks the historic occasion of its signature.
