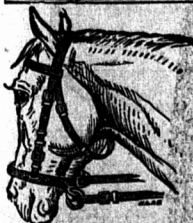

MARKET PRICES.—The following prices were secured on the Charlottetown market square yesterday and have prevailed since last Friday: White oats, 38 to 42c; black oats, 40 to 42c; potatoes, 25 to 30c; beef (quarter) per lb, 10 to 16c. The prices quoted by the wholesalers are: Potatoes, 25 to 28c; hay, 70 to 75c; white oats, 38 to 42c; black oats, 40 to 42c; straw, \$5.50 to \$6.50.

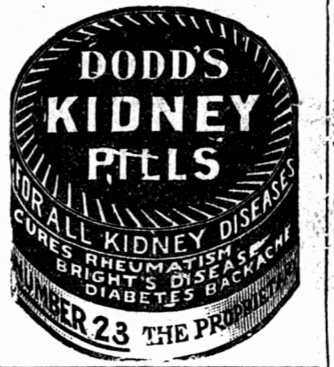

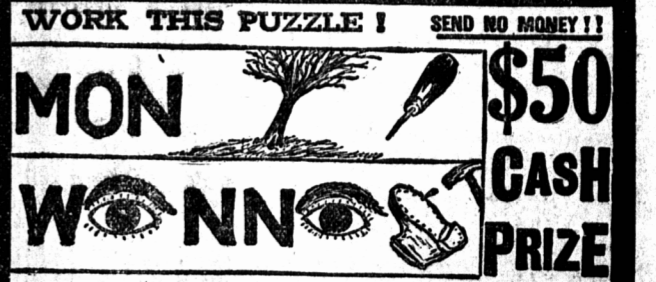
