## SENIOR "Y" ELIMINATE COLLEGIANS

P. W. C. Basketball Team Lose Second Game Of Series To "Y" Seniors, Who Take Round Score By One Point.

Came into last night's game with a handicap of six points, the Senior "Y" emerged victorious over P. W. C. after one of the most hotly contested and exciting games staged this year in the Holy Name gym. At the end of the first period the Collegians were 3 points up on the Senior Y, the score being 12 to 9, thus giving them a nine point lead in the round. Early in the second period, Y, led by "Lanky" Matheson, scored a brilliant comeback and drew upon even terms with their rivals, who were using every trick available to hold their lead. For another ten minutes the battle waged evenly—first one team tallying then the other, with technical fouls giving alternately each team a lead of one point. With about three minutes to go the Seniors again put forth every effort and although without the service of Hudson, star guard, who was disqualified on fouls, they managed to sink three field goals and a foul shot, winning the game by a score of 30 to 23, making this round of two games read 53 to 23. Earl Goss, on the whistle, did a splendid job of handling a very difficult match.
