## IN MEMORIAM

MR. GEORGE WILLIAM KING.

At the P. E. Island Hospital on 25th Feb., 1914, George William King of Boughton Island in the thirty-fourth year of his age, leaving a wife and family of eight to mourn his loss. He leaves a father and mother, and four brothers and three sisters, who deeply lament their loss. He was attended by Doctors Grant of Cardigan, Morris of Dundas, Dr. McIntyre of Montague and Dr. Stewart of Georgetown. After consultation and diagnosis of the case, it was decided to take him to the hospital. Suffering terrible pain in the region of the stomach it took much of the time of one of the Doctors to attend to this. He was five days suffering as the weather was very severe and stormy, and patient could not be removed. A very wonderful operation was performed, reflecting the very highest praise on the skill of the patient was free from pain. Continuing thus for four days or more—everything appeared fine when other complications arose, owing it is supposed to the length of time passed before removing him to the Hospital. It was considered a wonderful skill in Surgery, and great praise is due to the Medical attendants. But science was baffled and the man usually strong and muscular, man succumbed to the inevitable. His remains were taken to his brothers home at Gasparaux, and the following day, were interred at Sturgeon Methodist Cemetery. An unusually large cortege was present to pay the deceased the last tribute of respect. Mr. Beck the Presbyterian Minister, Georgetown preached the funeral sermon. The sermon in the church was marked by unusual solemnity, and many were moved to tears. An honest man—a good neighbor, kind and considerate to all has crossed the great divide—yet we mourn not without hope, for a good man here, is a good man there. The parents and other relations, tender their heartfelt thanks to the friends and neighbors in Boughton Island. We are all born to toil and trouble in this world, as sparks in close proximity, but we pray that God will reward them and show them comfort when their day of trouble comes.

## BIG SEIZURE OF LIQUOR AT CHATHAM

ST. JOHN, March 25.—Rev. R. H. St. John, of the Dominion Alliance, swore out a warrant Saturday morning, authorizing a search of the intercolonial freight shed for liquors, and proceeded to the station with Provincial Constable Brobecker. They overhauled barrels and cases, opening all of them that looked suspicious, and took possession of seven barrels and fourteen cases, which they carried away. While they were at work a citizen called and got a box containing two cases, removing the goods under their noses without attracting their attention. The seized packages were carried off to the Police Court. Then Officer Brobecker returned, surveyed the freight, and quickly fastened his eagle eye on an innocent looking sugar barrel addressed to "K. M." He opened it, and found that there was a barrel, apparently a barrel of whiskey, inside, nicely packed in sawdust. He paid the freight on this and removed it. The shipper's name was given as R. Mawley, St. John, and the package, like all the others that were seized, was shipped to order. It is the biggest liquor seizure that has been made here for a long time. As a punitive stroke it is a great success, but it will not lessen the sale of liquor in town. Mr. Stave's Prudential raids have not closed a bar or deprived any one of the chance to buy booze. Of the seized liquors three barrels and two cases were from Montreal and were branded "For personal use." The other five barrels, four cases were from St. John, and it was all shipped "to order," and the names of the consignees are not addressed to "K. M." He opened it, and
