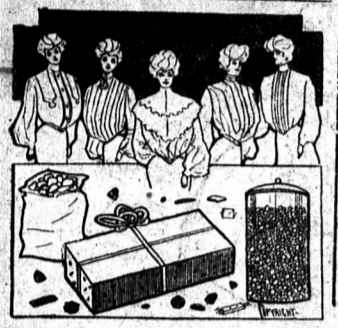

At the Supreme Court yesterday judgment was reserved in the case of Clark vs. McMurdo for a new trial and argument for a new trial in the case of Welsh vs. Guard was heard.

Owing to the severe storm Rev. Mr. Fullerton's lecture on the war between Russia and Japan, which was to have taken place last evening was postponed till next Friday evening.

The Laborers' Protective Union held their annual ball at their Hall, Kent Street last night. Notwithstanding the severity of the night there was a large attendance and a thoroughly enjoyable time was spent till well on in the wee sma' hours. The floor director for the evening was Andrew Hennessy.

By the recent returns from Pine Hill College, Halifax, N. S., it is noted that Eben McDougall has fully sustained his reputation as a student. He holds second place in all his classes in Theology and promises to be one of the most brilliant students of the college. The Guardian congratulates Mr. McDougall on his high standing.

The annual meeting of the Diocesan Church Society opened in St. Paul's church last evening with an eloquent sermon by Rev. W. B. Sisson, M. A., of Summerside. A meeting of the Executive was also held in the afternoon. A large number of the delegates are prevented from being present because of the storm and it is probable that many will not reach the city today. This morning there will be Holy Communion at 8:30 and the annual business meeting will be held this evening in St. Paul's schoolroom.

REPORTS from many cities and towns in West and Northwest tell of the most severe cold of the winter prevailing and in the majority of places the low temperature is intensified by a high wind. In Chicago the mercury fell from 22 above to six below zero in 24 hours.

THE snow storm that sprung up yesterday afternoon increased in violence towards evening and last night. The bitter east wind carried the light snow in blinding drifts and entirely filled in the paths that had been shovelled through the banks of last week. In the country the effects of the storm will be severely felt as the roads had just been broken after the downfall of last week. The cuttings on the railway will also suffer severely and it is expected that a great deal of work will be necessary today and tomorrow before the line is again placed in good running condition.

DESPITE the severity of the storm last night there was a large attendance of skaters at the rink in the annual Carnival of the season. The attendance of spectators was not so large, however, but was much greater than was expected considering the inclemency of the weather. There was more than the ordinary number of good costumes on the ice, though the ever present clown and kindred like predominated. The management have decided that owing to the storm and the absence of judges of costumes the Carnival will be repeated next Tuesday evening when the affair will be conducted on an even more elaborate scale than last night. The Fourth Regiment Band will be present and the handsome prizes offered for last night will be awarded. Owing to the repetition of the list of skaters will not be published till next week.

MOCK PARLIAMENT.

The Mock Parliament will meet Monday evening, February 6th at eight o'clock. The discussion on the Draft Address will be continued.

The Honourable the Minister of Justice will introduce a Bill entitled "An Act to Amend the Dominion Elections Act 1900," as follows—

An Act to Amend the Dominion Elections Act 1900.

His Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada enacts as follows—

(7) (d). Any person, not otherwise disqualified, who has not voted or who does not vote at any Dominion Election after the passing of this Act, and who has no valid excuse for not so voting, will be disqualified and incompetent to vote at any subsequent Dominion Election for seven (7) years from such failure to record his vote.

The following will be considered valid and sufficient reason for failure to record a vote.

(a) Absence from the Province in which the Electoral District is situated, if unavoidable.

(b) Sickness of voter, to be certified to if necessary by a medical or other competent authority.

(c) Very stormy weather so as to entail more than ordinary difficulty in reaching the polling booth, especially if residing or working at a greater distance than one mile from the said polling booth.

108 2 (a) Every candidate who by himself or by any agent or agents appointed by him, shall canvass any elector to vote for him or for such candidate, in any other way than by or in a public address or speech in a public meeting of electors called for the purpose of discussing political questions: or by or in the public press or by or through a printed circular addressed to the electors: shall be guilty of an illegal act: and if any such candidate by himself or any agent or agents does canvass, contrary to the provisions of this Act, and receives the majority of the votes cast in any such election, his election and return shall be null and void.
