POLICEMAN SHOT DEAD IN BATTLE WITH A PRISONER. CEDAR RAPIDS, Ia., Jan. 6.—With a bottle of nitro-glycerine in one hand and a pistol in the other, Harvey Lee, charged with burglary, held a squad of officers at bay in the county jail in Marion, six miles from here, for nearly an hour. Then he began firing his pistol, killing Police-constable Charles Gillin of Cedar Rapids and wounding Detective John Cook. The fight between Lee and the officers followed an attempted jail delivery. Sheriff Loftus was awakened by an explosion in the rear of the jail. Before he could dress a second explosion took place. He then discovered that the telephone wires had been cut, but finally got into communication with the police department, and six policemen were sent to the scene. After Gillin was killed, the other policemen rushed Lee and overpowered him. The other prisoners in the jail were panic-stricken and none attempted to escape. They were brought to Cedar Rapids for safe keeping. Sheriff's deputies are searching for the men who attempted to liberate Lee. The jail wall was only slightly damaged, the job apparently being the work of experienced men.
