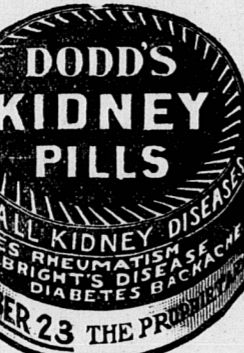

Sow the Seed as early in the Spring as possible, roll the ground perfectly level; the grass should be cut often, and never allowed to attain a length of over three inches.

## PROVINCIALIST IS TOURING THE WORLD

OAKLAND, Calif., April 24.—Miss Margaret Bagnall of Auckland, New Zealand, who is spending a few weeks in Brockton, Mass., as the guest of her cousin, John and Mrs. W. Stevenson and daughters of 32 Clarence street, is taking a trip around the world. The journey will take next year and Miss Bagnall is making the trip alone. She is a native of the Prince Edward Island, and when she was four years old her parents re- moved to New Zealand with the fam- ily of twelve children. "There are forty five grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren now," she re- marks. On the voyage she will visit the American fleet around the world. Miss Bagnall's brother, L. J. Bagnall, was a member of the executive committee of welcome was presented to Rear Admiral Sperry, handsomely bound in covers composed entirely of native woods from the various trees of the country, and embossed with gold from the mines.

Miss Bagnall left home the 13th of May last year, going first to Fiji Is- lands, where she was much interest- ed in the customs of the natives. "New Zealand is a very favored country," said Miss Bagnall, "for it is the first country on which the sun shines. New Zealand is sixteen hours ahead of time here. Do you know," she said as she looked at the clock, "it is twelve o'clock tomorrow in Auckland now? I lived three hun- dred and sixty seven days last year. As it was a leap year we had three hundred and sixty six days anyway, and I went to bed on the steamer, May 19, and when I awoke the next day it was again Tuesday, May 19."  
"From the Fiji Islands I went to Honolulu for a brief visit, coming from there to Victoria, B. C., and then to Vancouver, where I stayed ten days. By the Canadian Pacific I came on to Banff, the famous re- sort, where I located the Canadian National Park. Here lives the fam- ous herd of buffalo, given by Sir Donald Smith, now Lord Strathcona, to the government, almost the only ones in the world."  
"By early stages I journeyed to Toronto and by Lake Ontario to Niagara Falls, thence to Montreal and then to Worcester, Mass., where lives my mother's sister, a dear old lady of eighty three who is the only daughter living of a family of twelve children. The only son living is my uncle, ninety four years old, who lives in New Glasgow, P. E. I. He is bright and active and stands the cold better than the younger mem- bers of the family."
