ISLAND PREACHER RANKS HIGH AS STUDENT

The following is clipped from an Oshkosh, Wisconsin, exchange. The Reverend Dr. McInnis referred to is a native of Spryngton, this province, a son of the late Donald McInnis and his wife, formerly Miss McKinnon of Milton. The late Mr. J. A. McDonald, Stipendiary Magistrate of Charlottetown was a cousin as is also Mr. Murdoch Ross of this city. Mr. McInnis is certainly worthy of being classed among the "successful Islanders abroad," many of whom are now his fellow countrymen in the United States, one at least, in his cabinet, others as college professors, ministers of the gospel, lawyers &c.

Rev. G. Kenneth MacInnis, who is to speak at the Y. M. C. A., tomorrow afternoon at 3.30 on "The Philosophy of Success" was born and raised on a farm on Prince Edward Island, Canada. When only twelve years of age, his mother died and his father the following year. Left without home and parents, he started out to make his own way in the world. At the age of 15, he was a cook in the New Brunswick lumber camps. At sixteen he started to sea, and at twenty he was mate of a ship. That summer he gave up seafaring life. For nearly three years he roamed about the United States, working part of the time as a bridge builder and as a detective and in the gold and copper mines of Montana. In 1891 he was converted and soon began to preach. After four years Evangelistic work he came to Appleton, and at the age of thirty entered the sub-preparatory department of Lawrence University. His capital in cash was less than \$100. He was married and had one child.

In three years he completed the academic course, and while acting as pastor of a church he completed the college course, graduating with A. B. at the age of thirty-seven. From Lawrence he went to Northwestern where he took a course in theology. In conjunction with his pastoral duties, and college studies, he passed from year to year in his Conference examinations, and was ordained two years before he graduated from the University. Since graduation, Mr. MacInnis has received the degree of Doctor of Philosophy.

He has traveled extensively in Europe and America, and has visited the most interesting parts of Asia and Africa. Dr. MacInnis' mingled humor paths and hard facts most interestingly in his lectures and sermons.

RANKS HIGH AS A STUDENT. Earl Carlyle MacInnis, son of Rev. and Mrs. G. K. MacInnis, 108 Jefferson avenue, completed college work at Lawrence college, Appleton, this week. His student activities have eclipsed in extent and success practically every record Lawrence had kept for its long series of commencements. He was one of the seven to receive the summa cum laude for 1916 and was awarded the university of Wisconsin scholarship for all-around school activity. His father is pastor of the First Methodist Episcopal church of this city.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land, in each of three years. A homesteader may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Pre-emptor must reside in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Free-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house, worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, stubby or stony land, or stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W.
