These cattle were all accredited herds of Ayrshires belonging to Messrs Bert R Brown, MacRae Bros, Clark and Roper, of Prince Edward Island. It will be the first time that tuberculin tested herds have been shown in Amherst or taken part in the official milk test that will commence on Friday. Special wires of the building have been devoted to these cattle, as they must be kept free from contact with antised herds.

1920 Taxation Act - Part 1 Chap 3, Section 79.

(A) Such notice of the hearing of such appeals shall be given by the Provincial Treasurer in one issue of the Royal Gazette and in at least one newspaper published in this Province at least fourteen days before the hearing of such appeal and it shall be the duty of the Provincial Treasurer to give notice to the appellant by post addressed to the appellant at...

2nd. Is he willing to entertain the claim for refund of the companies that paid on a valuation of \$600 per pair?

Publication of such notice of the hearing of appeals in the Royal Gazette shall be deemed sufficient notice to the appellant of the time and place for the hearing of such appeal.
