### P. E. I. PROVINCIAL BRANCH OF ST. JOHN AMBULANCE ASSOCIATION.

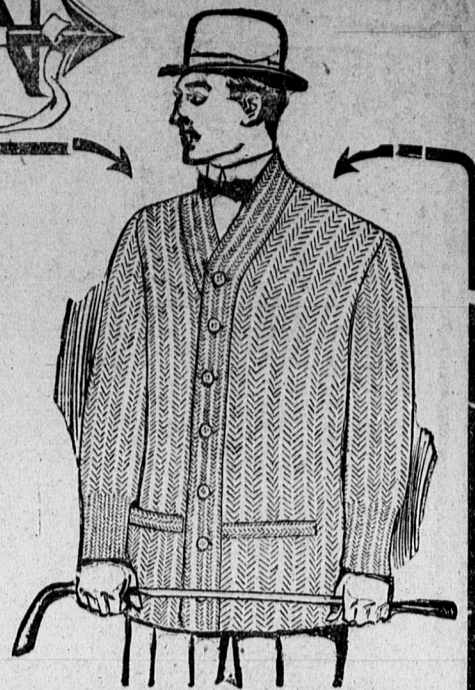

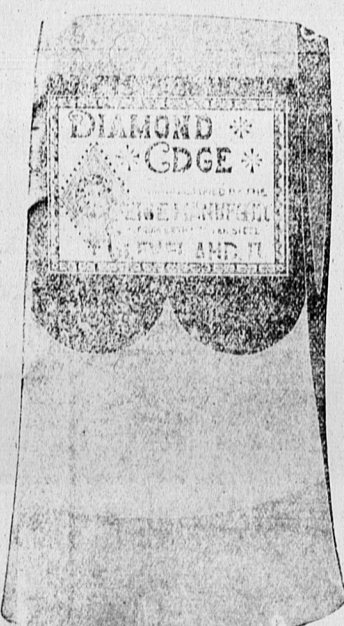
