BRITISH COLUMBIA RELEASES HINDUS

Governor-In-Council Under Act Cannot Delegate Powers to Subordinate Official -- Immigration Act.

VANCOUVER, B.C., March 26—The Dominion Order-in-Council was declared invalid today by Judge Clement because the order of the Governor-in-Council delegated to the Minister of the Interior powers which the Act grants to him only. Judgment was given in the test case of over 150 Hindus from Fiji. These Hindus held under the provisions of the order, were ordered released. His Lordship said he had considered this matter with his legal brethren and they agreed with him that it was a question whether the order did not go beyond the statute. The Legislature had said the Governor-in-Council might do certain things, and might make provisions for keeping out certain classes. The Governor-in-Council had not passed the Order-in-Council saying that a certain class should be kept out. He felt very strongly that the Legislature granted the Governor-in-Council certain powers, but the Governor-in-Council could not delegate such powers to any subordinate official, however high his standing. All the Hindus in the detention shed were liberated at three o'clock this afternoon.

"The formative power of books can never be over-rated; their subtle mastery to stimulate all the germs of intellectual and moral life that lie enfolded in the mind. As the poet sings:— "Books are not seldom talismans and spells." Why should they not be so? They furnish us the means, and the only means, whereby we may hold communion with the master spirits of all ages. They make us acquainted with the best thoughts which the human mind has produced, expressed in the noble language."—"A Book for all readers."

Countess Vera Tolstoi, a daughter of the Russian author, is said to be much interested in America. She possesses considerable literary ability and has written frequently for Russian periodicals. The first of her sketches, translated into English, however, is an account of an imaginary visit to this country.

William de Morgan, about whom a suddenly-aroused public curiosity has existed since the fact that he is seventy-eight years of age, was crowned his two novels of last year, "Joseph Vance," and "Alice-for-Short," with a third, which contains in an even higher degree the qualities which made notable works of both and which depicted a much longer story from the theory of the novel as practiced by our contemporaries. "Somehow Good," handled in this country by the Copp Clark Company is not merely one of the great novels of the period, but probably one of the great novels of a much longer period than what we usually cover by that term; though the rush to rank its creator with Dickens, Thackeray and Meredith is as absurd as it is unheeded. Mr. de Morgan has revived the Thackerayan formula for novel-writing, and with success, but it will follow that he must be a Thackeray.

"The aid which a well equipped library can furnish to all the higher institutions of learning, the academy, the seminary, the college, and the university, is quite incalculable. Their students are constantly engaged upon themes which not only demand the text-books they study, but collateral illustrations almost without numbers. The professors, too, who impart instruction, perpetually need to be instructed themselves, with fuller knowledge upon the themes they are daily called upon to elucidate. There is no text book that can teach all, or anywhere near all there is upon the subject it professes to cover. So the library which has many books upon that subject comes in to supply its deficiencies."—Spofford.
