A THIRD STEAMER.

No one who knows anything of winter navigation by ice-breaking steamers as it is conducted in the waters of Russia, Denmark, Sweden and Norway, or in the upper great lake waters of North America, will for one moment believe that the navigation of the straits of Northumberland during the past six weeks was an impossibility. There are routes much farther to the north and quite as difficult as ours on which steamers ply with almost the regularity of clock-work, some of them carrying trains of loaded cars on their decks. But these routes are equipped with proper ice-breaking steamers which we have not. Our Stanley and Minto are of the type of a quarter century ago. They are simply the ordinary steamer strengthened to stand the shock and designed to push their way through the ice and with more than the usual engine power for steamers of their size.

The Minto although built much later than the Stanley is no improvement on the earlier boat, except in the matter of greater engine power. This has been demonstrated in actual service. Where the conditions are such that the Stanley cannot cross the Straits, the Minto cannot cross. Obviously what is wanted is a steamer of much greater engine power - greater size and strength and equipped with the modern appliances for boring into and breaking up the ice which it encounters. The ice breaker which simply acts as a battering ram or a wedge as ours do is altogether obsolete in countries where ice-navigation is now carried on. The Minister of Marine and the officers of his department if they have given any attention at all to this subject must be aware of these facts, and as yet have done nothing to bring our winter service up to date.

We therefore insist and we trust our representatives in the Senate and Commons will insist that the Government shall provide at once a winter steamer embodying the latest improvements, and of sufficient power and strength to thoroughly test the practicability of navigating the straits at all times in winter. It seems absolutely necessary that two different routes shall be utilized at the same time, as the conditions of wind and tide are so different in eastern and western routes that when one may be temporarily

impracticable the other may be practicable. Until we have this third, more powerful and up-to-date ice-breaker the Government cannot be said to be making any reasonable attempt to keep the navigation open. With two routes thus equipped and the steamers commanded by energetic and experienced captains any such long interruptions of transit as we have had this winter and in previous years ought not to recur. Surely we are entitled to this improved winter service until the tunnel shall be constructed. That we must look to as the only complete and satisfactory solution of our intolerable winter isolation.

Nero is said to have fiddled while Rome burned. And we read of the officers and crew of the Stanley having a very enjoyable ball at Georgetown, while our cattle are starving for want of the hay piled up at Pictou. It is now thirty eight days since the Stanley has visited Pictou.

By the census of 1901 the population of the Northwest Territories was 160,800. It is now much greater, but there is no reason to suppose that its denominational complexion is much changed. In 1901 there were 80,000 Roman Catholics in the Territories - less than one fifth of the total. It is upon a population so composed that Sir Wilfrid Laurier proposes to establish for all time the separate school system. In Manitoba, which threw off the separate school system years ago, the Catholic population at last census was about one seventh of the total.

The Russian Admiral and officers of the fleet at Port Arthur were at a ball when the Japanese torpedo flotilla attacked and sank a number of the Russian ships. The gaiety was ill-timed. Watchfulness and attention to duty would have avoided the disaster and might have turned the fortunes of the war. When we hear of the officers and crew of the Stanley having a dance at Georgetown we conclude that the hilarity had better have been postponed until the interrupted navigation was reopened. A dance in Pictou after having got across would not have been so open to criticism.

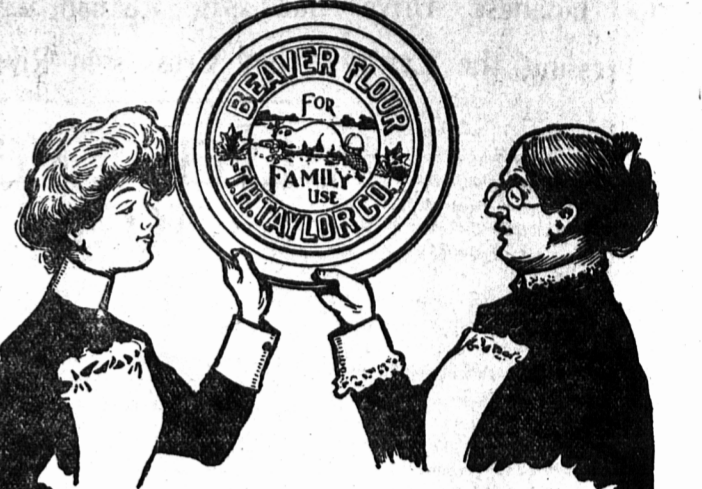
