RURAL ROUTES.—An exchange in a lengthy article on "How dealers can use the Parcel Post" comments on the rural free delivery in the Island as follows: Today almost the whole of Prince Edward Island is covered by rural free delivery routes, and the system is also spreading through Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. The development is accompanied by an increase in rural telephones. There is scarcely a community in the whole of the Island that has not a rural mail route or one or more telephones.

First-class Malpeque oysters brought a high price during the latter part of the season. The demand could not be satisfied for No. 1 Malpeque "cup" oysters, even at the high rate of \$11 per barrel.
