Hon. A. W. Matheson, Minister of Health and Welfare, replied to the brief recently presented to the Provincial Government by the Cerebral Palsy Parent Group when he addressed the group at their monthly meeting at the Y. M. C. A. Tuesday evening. Mr. Matheson, stressing the need of speech and occupational therapy for cerebral palsy victims, said that his department would provide the training for anyone interested in undertaking the work and with the necessary educational qualifications. Films on the efforts of cerebral palsy were shown following the minister's address. Mrs. Daniel Farquharson, president, presided over the meeting.
