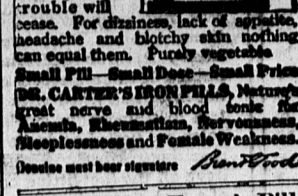

Open Letter to Fox Ranchers

AN OPEN LETTER FROM HON. A. E. ARSENAULT TO THE FOX RANCHERS AND COMPANIES OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.

Gentlemen:—After the incorporation of the Silver Fox Fur Selling Association of Prince Edward Island, I was asked by the Provisional Directors to undertake the organization of the Company...

A campaign of publicity and education was started through the press and by holding meetings in different sections of the province at first I seemed to be making very slow progress...

I have completed the first series of meetings and now have to acknowledge my thanks and appreciation for the cordial reception I received on the part of those who attended...

Although I have not regarded this as a personal matter, I yet can assure the three hundred ranchers who attended these meetings that I appreciate in highest degree their courtesy in the premises and the great interest and enthusiasm with which they received the message which I brought to them.

To these men I have one request to make. I have been impressed by the remarks of those who seconded my efforts, if they are convinced of the need of such an Association, then I earnestly urge them to do pioneer work among their neighbors to the end that they too may be brought to a realization of their responsibilities.

Gentlemen: The most important part of the work is still ahead of us.

FOX AND FUR NOTES

5th. We must have one seller to many buyers rather than many sellers to few buyers, thus ensuring an enlarged market and a staple market.

Let us then co-operate in selling a trade marked fur of which we can be proud and with which the buyer and consumer will be pleased and so sustain the reputation of the Prince Edward Island Silver Fox as the best in the world.

All these things and many other things of benefit to the Fox Industry can be accomplished if the foxmen of Prince Edward Island get together and back up the Silver Fox Fur Selling Association.

The opportunity is now at hand. It knocks at your door. If you fail to answer the call, opportunity will pass by probably never to return.

Foxmen: The men at the back of the Silver Fox Fur Selling Association are in it not for their personal gain, but for the general benefit of the Fox Industry. They have taken hold temporarily until the share holders meet and appoint permanent Directors.

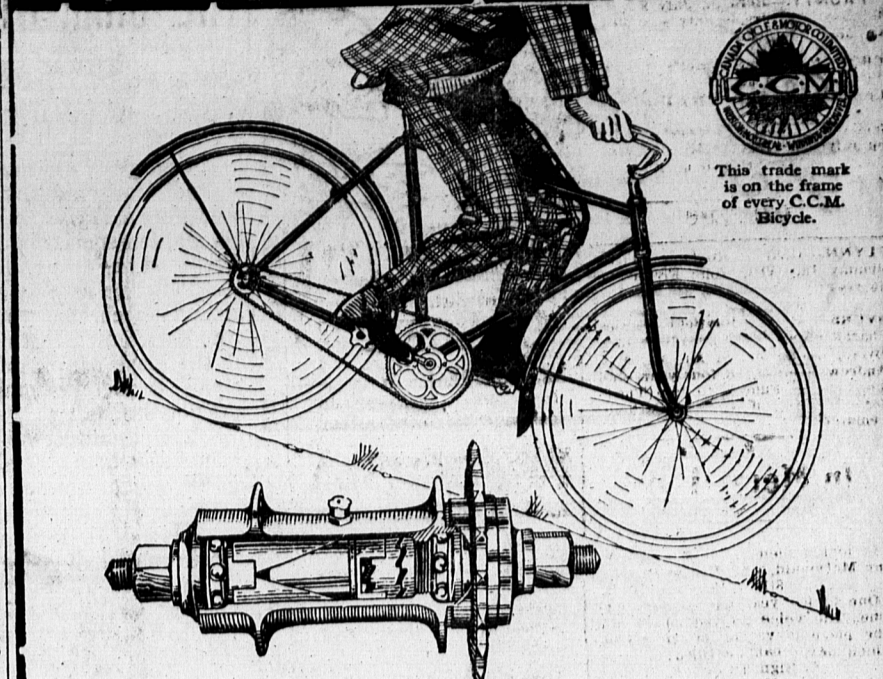

Exportation of Wheat From Argentina

BUENOS AIRES, July 9.—Further exportations of wheat from Argentina are limited to 500,000 tons, according to a decree issued by President Rigobon yesterday. This is the 900,000 tons exported since the wheat super tax law was enacted on June 10, brings the total to 1,400,000 tons, which the government considers exhausts the balance above domestic needs which is available for export.

Crement Still At Ellis' Island

(Special to The Guardian) NEW YORK, July 12.—Arthur Crement is held without bail and still in detention at Ellis Island awaiting deportation to Montreal where he will face a charge of conspiracy. Immigration officials stated this morning that the man would not be moved until instructions are received from Washington.

NOVA SCOTIA HEALTH CRUSADE.

HALIFAX, July 12.—An official send off at City Hall was given the first Nova Scotia red cross caravan which will tour the rural districts in Nova Scotia, in the interests of public health. The caravan comprises 8 motor ambulances and has a staff of 20 doctors, nurses and assistants.

ST. JOHN STRIKE AVERTED.

ST. JOHN, N.B., July 12.—A threatened strike of the employees of the New Brunswick Power Company which takes in all the workers in the Gas House, Power House and Street Railway, has been temporarily averted by a conference between the members of the Employees Union and the management of the company, the city commissioners and Mayor Schofield, held in City Hall this morning. A new agreement between the company and the men was drawn up this afternoon and the trial of the one man car, the original bone of contention, has been postponed.

They All Want to Marry Him Now.

SYDNEY, N.S., July 12.—Captain Thomas Kitchen, C.F.A. of this city whose fiancée, Miss A. Butler of Manchester, England, when on a voyage to Halifax to marry the Canadian officer, transferred her affections to Lieut. T. Mellor, of London, is in receipt of letters from English ladies who express a desire to marry the gallant Canadian. Including among the letters is one from a young English Duchess who expressed sympathy for Captain Kitchen and offered to come to Sydney and marry him. The Captain refuses to divulge the identity of the Duchess.

Napoleon's Widow Died in Spain

PARIS, July 12.—Eugene, widow of Napoleon III, and last Empress of France, died at her home in Spain today.

Death occurred shortly before eight o'clock from acute intestinal inflammation. She passed away quietly in the presence only of her lady in waiting. The nephew, the Duke of Alba, at whose residence she died, was in France, and the other members of the family were absent. Full imperial honors will be accorded at her funeral. For the people of France she has been for more than half a century the living embodiment of historic days; the story of the Empire; its fall; the revolution that gave birth to the Republic after the defeat at the hands of Prussia; forty marvellous years of age amazingly swift construction; the great war, with its four years of suffering; and finally the day of revenge.
