THE train from the west was delayed at Royalty Junction yesterday morning on account of an accident to the flange of one of the box cars. The car left the track, and it took some time to replace it. The passengers came to town by the eastern train.

Not one of the half dozen sheets of plate in the fronts destroyed by the explosion in Beverley's store, Germain street, St John have yet been replaced, and the stores are carrying on business under difficulties. There is a dispute as to whether the fire or the plate glass insurance companies should bear the loss. The plate glass companies do not insure against fire and naturally hold that it was fire that caused the breakage. The fire companies say an explosion did the damage. It is a fine point for argument.
