3rd I cordially invite all farmers, dealers, and shippers to come and inspect the warehouse and see the new Haines Electric Potato Grader in operation. Let me assure you it is the latest and most up-to-date Potato Grader ever set in operation. 4th Our stock for the opening consists of the following: Fertilizers, Lime, Flour, Feeds, Bran, Middlings, Seeds, (Timothy, Clover, Turnips, and Vegetable—all varieties) and Seed Potatoes.

5th VERY IMPORTANT. I am of the opinion that a different method of marketing the farmer's Potatoes and Turnips near Charlottetown should be adopted. To illustrate why, there are growers in this section who accepted bags last January from small loaders, who sometimes call themselves agents, who make a habit of advising farmers not to haul as the price will go higher, in some cases promising to pay more than the market would stand, and when it comes to paying, they settle with the farmer a few cents below what they quoted, and in many cases the farmer still has his potatoes. To overcome this situation, which has been prominent for some time, I would ask my customers to do business with the office direct. In the fall, when produce will be moving in volume, I will have the boys that scouted for me last fall and this spring, supplied with trucks and they will work on a salary.

6th I have in stock a limited quantity of Government Certified Clear Field Mountain Seed No. 1 SMALL, quite a quantity of Cobblers, No. 1 Grade, also No. 1 SMALL Seed Cobblers, and a few Blues, and will exchange same for Table Stock. 7th We have a weak Potato market, but I am in a position to buy all the Potatoes, Seed or Table Stock, and Turnips, in the section. Why not exchange your holdings for whatever Lime, Fertilizer, or Seeds you want, we can kill two birds with the one stone—truck your Fertilizers out and haul in your Potatoes and Turnips. 8th I would advise against increasing your Potato acreage this spring, as it looks as if prices may not be high this fall, and above all, plant Seed Cobblers, NOT Table Stock Cobblers. 9th Why not buy your Fertilizers from firms that will buy your Turnips and Potatoes in the fall.

10th Take into consideration that last winter, on account of practically no snow in your fields, you must use a little more Fertilizer per acre than before, especially Potash. 11th Some farmers have more potatoes on hand today than they should, unfortunately they listened to anonymous newspaper reports on short crops. Usually these short crop reports have long strings that are sometimes very elastic. In future, consult the firm whose name is on the bag, not an agent. 12th Why This Is The Place For Farmers To Trade. I feel confident that my overhead is less than any other Produce Dealer in Charlottetown, no rent, all my help, with the exception of one employee, work by the hour. When there is no hauling I am under no expense, and I welcome competition, and remember this—anything I buy I guarantee my price to be as high as is going, anything offered for sale or trade our price will be competitive, and will be glad to continue patronage from my old customers, and will be glad to take on new ones. IN MEMORIAM JOHN N. MACDONALD

On Feb. 12, 1937, there passed peacefully away at his home in Blooming Point, John N. MacDonald, in his 82nd year. His long and active life was a model of integrity and uprighteousness. He adhered strictly to his Christian ideals of honor and at his demise the community mourns the loss of one of the best neighbors it has ever known. Amazingly energetic and industrious, his splendid physique carried him through a lifetime of arduous toil to the enjoyment of a ripe old age. It is truly to the men of his type that we of to-day owe the share of prosperity and comfort that is ours. By his death another link with the early days of Blooming Point has been severed, another stalwart builder of our community has been removed, and "finis" has been written to another chapter of pioneer life.
