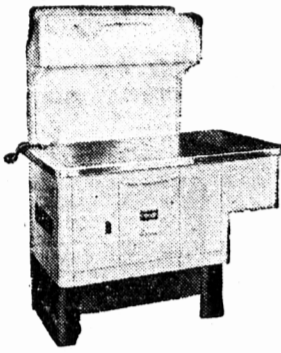
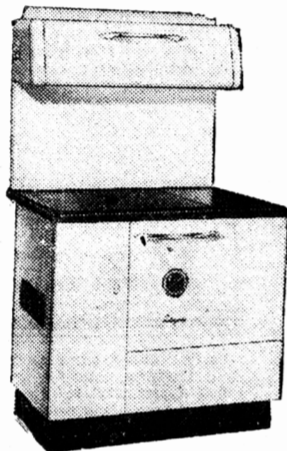

#### Blood Donor Clinic At Summerside On Monday

The Mobile Team from the Maritime Depot of the Canadian Red Cross Blood Transfusion Service at Halifax is due to arrive in Summerside on Sunday evening, Dec. 11th. Dr. Russel, the Assistant Medical Director of the Maritime Depot, will be in charge this time and will be accompanied by eleven ladies, a Registered Nurse, a Laboratory Technician, six V.A.D.'s and three drivers.

The Clinics in Summerside will be held in St. Mary's Hall, on Monday, December 12th, between 2:00 and 4:00 P.M. and 7:00 and 9:00 P.M. One hundred and fifty (150) donors are needed to fulfill the quota set for Summerside on this visit and to maintain in the Prince County Hospital during the next three months, as well as repay the amount already overdrawn from the Maritime Bank.

Arrangements for the Clinics are under the capable leadership of Mr. W. A. Currie, who is the Chairman of the Blood Donor Committee of the Summerside Red Cross Branch. Members of the Y's Men's Club, the Catholic Women's League, the Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire and of the Summerside Red Cross Branch are giving Mr. Currie valuable assistance in preparing for the Clinics and carrying them out.

On Tuesday the Team will hold a Clinic at the R.C.A.F. Station Hospital in the afternoon between 2:00 and 5:00 when the quota set is 120 donors. Squadron Leader R. L. Walsh is making all the arrangements for this Clinic.
