THIS IS THE DOMINION'S BUSY DAY.

This will be a busy day throughout all of them to a very great extent, Canada. And it will be an eventful day as well. From Sydney to Dawson the men of Canada, in addition to the ordinary affairs of life, will have business to do at the polls for themselves, for Canada and for the Empire.

At a general election the people of Canada assemble at some eight thousand polling places to select their representatives in a new Parliament which may last for five years. One by one they enter a place apart and in silence and secrecy mark their ballots for the men of their choice.

At a general election the fate of the Government of the day is always in issue, however much the preponderance of opinion may be in favor of one party or the other. That of itself is a great issue. It carries with it a great responsibility on the part of the voters, which all intelligent and patriotic men must feel. And the electors of Canada are, as a body about as intelligent and patriotic as any in the world.

Today there is another equally important issue to be pronounced upon. A great international agreement has been made, in regard to which the electors are asked to signify their favor or their disfavor. Both those who believe in reciprocal trade and those who oppose it agree that the results of the voting upon that question must be important and may be momentous.

In a very direct way the agreement, if it goes into effect, will touch the pocket, either for profit or loss, of every man in Canada. It will affect the producer and the consumer, not

but most of them to an appreciable extent. Nothing in that regard will be quite as it has been.

To a considerable degree also, and more than at the ordinary Dominion elections, national, international and imperial interests and relations are involved in the question at issue.

This will give pause to thoughtful electors, and we believe that never before have the electors of Canada approached the ballot box in a more serious frame of mind than they will to-day.

To those who have faith in the integrity and common sense of the people there will come little fear that the decision made by the majority of the people will not be in the main a right decision. In national as in individual affairs "there's a Divinity that shapes our ends, rough-hew them as we will."

Very regrettably some corrupt and corrupting agencies, dishonest devices and fraudulent tricks have come into the contest at various points throughout the Dominion. Probably our own Province is as free as any from such lebasaging agencies. Here the public campaign has been conducted mainly at joint meetings, conducted in an orderly and courteous manner, that does credit to all concerned.

The Guardian hopes to present to its readers tomorrow morning the result of the polling in this Province and throughout Canada. As to what the general result shall be, our expectation has not changed from what it has been, but whatever the result may be, we shall loyally accept the verdict of the great jury, the Canadian people.

MR. FIELDING'S TELEGRAM.

We were shown Hon. Mr. Fielding's telegram to Mr. Warburton after Tuesday night's meetings in this city. It was then too late, with the pressure of other matters to refer to it at any length in yesterday morning's paper. It refers only to the question of railway rates, but that is a matter of great importance and we are glad to have Mr. Fielding's assurance of his powerful assistance in securing a satisfactory solution of the three-short haul grievance.

We take it that Mr. Fielding speaks in this matter with the authority of the Government, and as Mr. Borden had spoken earlier in regard to this and other matters affecting our transportation we have both parties committed to find a remedy for what

has long been regarded as a most serious grievance. Once the Government seriously takes the matter in hand there ought to be little difficulty or delay in affording the desired relief, and the matter is one which cannot be allowed to rest until it is now disposed of.

We believe the assurance given by the Minister of Finance, late as it is, will be a source of some relief and satisfaction to many persons who, like The Guardian, had regarded the transportation as of most vital importance to the best interests of the Province. Its early fulfilment will be awaited with the greatest interest in view of the fact that the time for the fall shipments of produce is now at hand, and the hope of enlarged trade and larger markets has been for months past kept prominently before the people.
