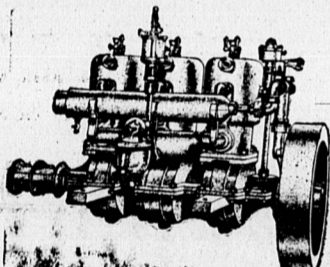
MEDICAL COUNCIL EXAMINATION.

LOS ANGELES, July 15.—That Elsie Sigel outside of being the murdered victim of Chinese took poison with suicidal intent in Leon Ling's rooms is the statement made in the official Court bulletin of Peon, China, translated in Denver.

DOMINION FINANCES AND THE SURPLUS.

OTTAWA, July 15.—The final returns of revenue and expenditure for the fiscal year were made public by the Finance Department.—Total revenue is \$85,093,403. Total expenditure on consolidated funds, \$84,071,245. The surplus over ordinary expenditure was therefore \$1,022,162.

The expenditure on capital was \$46,838,268, of which the National Transcontinental Railway is responsible for \$25,000,000 and the assumption of liabilities of the Quebec Bridge Co., \$6,400,000. Railway subsidies amounting to \$1,785,887 were paid and bounties to \$2,467,306.

The increase in the National Debt was \$45,969,399, or a little less than Mr. Fielding's estimate of \$46,000,000. The total net debt on 31st March was \$323,930,259.
