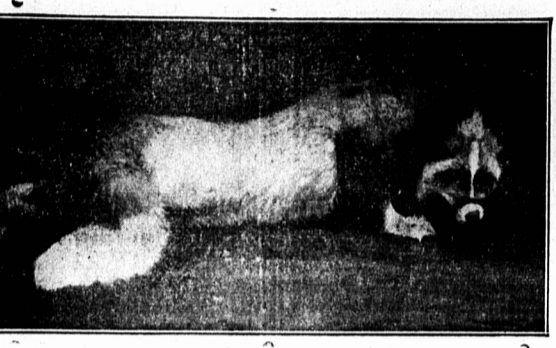

POULTRY NOTES

Many poultrymen have the idea that they must keep their hens under super sanitary conditions, that they must not be allowed to eat anything which has not been properly prepared and is free from contamination.

When you feed scratch grain on the floor in the litter the birds get enough fibre so that they are not inclined to pull and eat each other's feathers. Also it gives them a certain amount of work and helps keep the litter dry.

The body of a bird is composed of about two-thirds water, and the younger being somewhat greater. Experimental data show that a bird under average conditions will consume about two pounds of water for each one pound of feed.

As to how long you should keep hens depends upon what you know about them. Ordinarily hens lay a few less eggs each year. Poultrymen differ in practice of culling. Some cull out their birds by the first laying year, others who think a lot of individual birds, keep them just as long as they live.

TIMELY NOTES ON TOPICS CONNECTED WITH Silver Fox Farming

Intending exhibitors of non-registered silver foxes who have received a copy of the Live Fox Show catalogue will please add to Class 3, marked Silvers, another division of 250, but are well worth the money. Most of the ranchers feed horse meat in large quantities for two reasons—because it is cheap and because they believe it is an excellent fur producer.

Dr. A. E. Cliffe, authority on animal nutrition, by radio, advised to be one of the speakers at the Provincial Fox Show Banquet to be held at The Charlottetown Hotel next Wednesday evening at 7:30 o'clock.
