SYDNEY, N. S., June 8.—Bert Harris and E. ### Titled Lady Joins Salvationists

(By Dominion News Service)

LONDON, June 8.—One rather associates recruits to the Salvation Army with the gutter rather than with Baronial halls. That is because the Salvation Army makes its appeal to those who have sunk in life rather than to those who have succeeded. But the other day at the Clapton Congress Hall of the Salvation Army among 500 who were promoted to commissioned rank there was a young lady whose name was announced as Captain Anne Kinnaird.

The Captain Anne Kinnaird in her blue bonnet with the red band and her simple blue uniform did not look at all out of place among her 499 associates, even though she had not come from the gutter or from the middle classes, but from one of the oldest branches of the Scottish aristocracy.

For Captain Anne Kinnaird is in private life the Honourable Anne Kinnaird, daughter of Lord Kinnaird, whose ancestors received a baronetcy in 1682. Lord Kinnaird is a Knight of the Thistle, a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, Deputy Lieutenant for his Country, Justice of the Peace for his district, and for three years was Lord High Commissioner to the Church of Scotland.

Undoubtedly the Hon. Anne Kinnaird early in her life assimilated the consciousness that she owed a duty to her fellows. Her aunt, the Honourable Emily Kinnaird, C. B. E., O. B. E., was, according to Who's who, educated at home under the old-fashioned system. She has been Vice-President of the Young Women's Christian Association of Great Britain, and also Vice-President of the World's Young Women's Christian Association. She has also been Vice-President of the Bible and Medical Mission, a member of the British Committee of the World Alliance for International Churches. Her recreation is bicycling.
