RECORD NUMBER AT D. R. A. SHOOT

OTTAWA, Aug. 24.—It is expected that the competitors on the D. R. A. shoot, which takes place on Monday at Rockcliffe range, will reach the number of 297. This will be the largest gathering in the record of shooting in Canada. Last year the competitors numbered only 100 and already this year 400 entries have been received. It is thought that a good share of the \$10,000 prize money will go to outsiders. The Australian and English teams are very strong and there are said to be good marksmen among the Newfoundland six.

ARDELLE'S COLORS FALL AT READVILLE

READVILLE, Mass., August 24.—Arjelle, Ed Geers' noted pacing mare, was defeated for the second time in her career at the Readville track. Her long and successful racing career, for Argot Boy was the one to lower her colors, as he did here a year ago. In the first heat Arjelle broke at the distance, but in the two following Argot Boy was clearly the better when it came to the final test in the home stretch. In the 2:05 trot, George M., held his field cheap, having only to jog at the finish of each heat. A large delegation was present from New York, headed by W. E. Burk, owner of the gelding. The race marked the initial defeat of the season of the Cleveland mare, Lillian R. A series of very close finishes resulted in the 2:10 trot, Henry H., barely gaining the victory in each heat, Prince Travlesso and Prince C., in turn succeeded in tipping a second in going to the wire. Byron Kay had no trouble in the 2:14 miler, Gentry's Star tralling him in the first two heats, and Arrow in the final heat.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY unnumbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 21, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section acres, more or less. Entry must be made, personally at the local office for the district in which the land is situated. The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each year for three consecutive years. (2) If the father, or mother, if the father is deceased, of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the farm entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. (3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.
