**Junior Golds Continue Active At Montreal**

MONTREAL, Aug. 28—(CP)—The "junior" gold continued to lead activity on the stock exchange and curb market today although turning in this group, while still relatively high, showed moderate recession from yesterday's heavy dealings. Changes among selected issues in the industrial groups were evenly distributed.

Index averages listed banks up .08 to 27.03; utilities off .3 to 76.4; industrials up .3 to 120.2; papers up 2.84 to 341.94; and golds up 26 to 1777. Mining volume reached an impressive 723,500 shares while industrial volume totalled 30,000.

Leveling off tendencies were exhibited by some of the more active issues today. Eldon, with a turnover of 87,550 shares, dropped 5 cents at 2.20; and Donalda with a turnover of 13,800 shares dropped 5 cents at 1.25.
