Encouraging reports are being received from England in regard to the demand for the product of Canadian creameries. Irish supply of butter is insufficient to meet the demand, and American butter is as dear as Canadian. As Canadian shippers are finding great difficulty in securing refrigerated space for butter, it looks as if some of it will have to go to cold store there, and this will control supplies to British market for the time being.

The Ottawa Free Press says: The appeal made to the Finlanders to make Canada their home in the event of their being driven out of their country by the process of Russanizing now in progress, have not been in vain. It is announced that a deputation has asked the British Columbia government to grant Malcolm Island to certain Finlanders who propose to emigrate. They want the island set apart for their exclusive use with all rights of ownership free of cost, but subject to the settlement duties imposed by the Lands Act. They propose that the colony will be conducted as a joint stock company with a provision that the annual dividend is never to exceed five per cent. The profits are to be divided apart from dividends to stock holders, in two amounts, one for the general use of the colony and the other as an addition or bonus to the regular wages of the workers. The company proposes to employ only its own shareholders and will lease to it employes a certain acreage of land at the lowest possible rental.

At the meeting of the Public Schools Teachers yesterday Mr. Ansley announced that Messrs. W. J. Gage & Co., of Toronto would give a gold medal as a first prize, and that Messrs. Geo. Prizes to be awarded at the close of the schools next June. The details of the competition are to be arranged by Dr. Anderson chief Supt. of Education.

Pierce and J. W. McKenzie. After the ceremony a dainty lunch was served by the host and hostess and at its conclusion Mr. R. N. Cox proposed the health and happiness of the couple in a neat speech. After the Rev. J. W. McKenzie had supported the toast in a happy manner it was drunk in clear cold water. It is needless to say that the groom happily responded. The happy couple left by the 2:30 train for Charlottetown and registered at the Queen Hotel. This morning they will proceed to the groom's old home in Clinton and after spending a few days will leave for their future home. THE GUARDIAN extends congratulations.

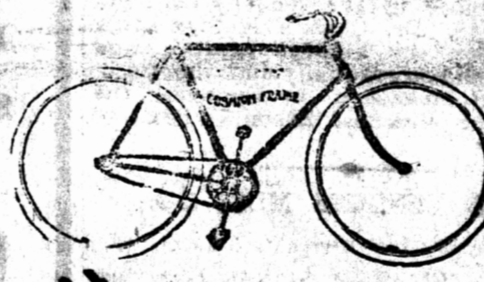

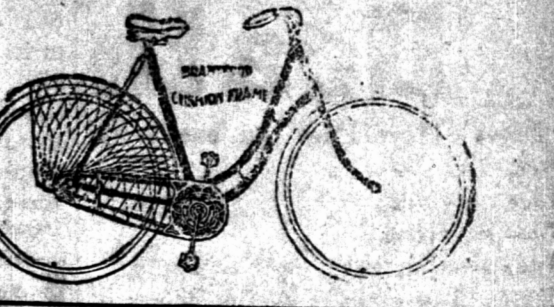
