# STOCK QUOTATIONS

## Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, Nov. 10.—The most important piece of news is the \$1.50 dividend declared by General Motors. This dividend, no doubt, meets the most optimistic expectations and will probably have an important influence on motor stocks today. In as much as Chrysler directors are scheduled to meet this afternoon to issue the third quarterly statement and also to act on dividend there will probably be considerable interest in Chrysler marketwise. Another favorable development at the General Motors meeting was the announcement that a bonus would be paid to employees around Christmas with a minimum of \$35 per employee. This will involve an expenditure of about \$10,000,000. The bonus and extra dividends being declared should be an additional stimulus to the merchandise stocks. In addition to the Chrysler meeting today there are several others of importance, Columbia Carbon, National Sugar, Pennick and Ford and Remington Rand. We would look for a firm and active opening today and believe the motors and mer-

chandise stocks will continue in front. While Motors near the top yesterday acted as though it would do better.

MONTREAL, Nov. 10.—Union Gas Co. six months to Sept. 30 reveals a consolidated loss before income tax of \$19,341 compared with a profit of \$11,333 in corresponding period of 1935. Depreciation charges, however, were greater by \$34,082 than in same period a year ago.

Teek Hughes—President Forbes expected three more years of production from present levels of the Teek Hughes property and then a couple of years of cleaning upper levels which may still yield a profit.

Silver—Price of foreign mined silver advanced 2 3/4 cents an ounce to 47.50 cents. Present United States price is 45 cents an ounce. Consumers Gas earnings year ended Sept. 30 equal to \$6.70 per share compared with \$6.41 preceding year and dividend requirements of \$10 per share.

Eggs were quiet with graded shipments in carlots or less selling at 45 to 46 cents a dozen for A-large, 40 to 41 for A-medium, 34 to 35 for A-pullers, 26 to 27 for B and 22 to 23 1-2 for C.

Cheese averaged 14 cents for Ontario and 13 1-2 for Quebecs. Potatoes: Que. and N. B. Mts. 80's \$1.10 to \$1.15; Que. No. 2 80's 50 to \$1; P. E. I. Mts. 90's \$1.25 to \$1.30.
