## EDITOR OF NEWCASTLE ADVOCATE ON THE STAND

ST. JOHN, Sept. 12.—At the afternoon session of the Circuit Court yesterday before Justice White, the case of the King vs. C. Bruce McDougall was resumed. After some difficulty John W. Hornbrook was sworn as the twelfth juror.

In opening the case for the Crown Attorney General Hazen extended a warm welcome to Messrs. Ritchie and Mellish, the visiting counsel, and asked that all courtesies of the New Brunswick bar be extended to them.

H. H. Stewart, editor of the Newcastle advocate, declared that in July, 1908, he went to Moncton to meet McDougall. There a bargain was arranged that 2500 copies of Free Speech should be printed for \$20 in the Advocate office. The first issue published from the Advocate office was dated July 25, 1908. Since that date the paper had been printed regularly. Witness had told McDougall that one or more of the articles would cause him to face a libel suit.

Mr. Stewart declared he did not know the proprietor of Free Speech but recognized that the paper was printed in the advocate office from the style of type used. Witness Loggie.

To Mr. Baxter, the witness declared that the copy had been sent by McDougall. He never saw any copy purporting to come from Loggie.

Several papers were handed to witness and certain articles pointed out, which he declared had been sent by Mr. McDougall. All remittances had been sent by the prisoner.

To Mr. Ritchie, the witness said that he had received the impression from McDougall that Loggie was taking the responsibility for the paper.

Steadman Crandall, postmaster at Moncton, was sworn and said he did not know W. C. Loggie. He had seen McDougall write and considered it was the defendant's signature on express orders, which were handed him. He never saw McDougall taking Free Speech mail from the post office.

## SUMMERSIDE WATER COMMISSION.

MR. EDITOR:—At the request of several prominent citizens I have nominated as Water Commissioner for the Town of Summerside. The affairs of the Water Commission have been in a very unsettled state for the past twelve months and it would appear that the Town Council, in order to prevent further confusion, pressed upon the Commissioners to resign office. Notwithstanding this, the Town is to be put to the expense of another election.

In my opinion too much money has been paid out in salaries to the Water Commissioners for the amount of work they have to do, and I believe that the taxpayers might well be relieved from the necessity of paying these needless amounts.

From a financial standpoint the water system at present is not satisfactory as the cost to the town today is about sixty-seven cents per thousand gallons, when, to be on a solid basis, it should be only six cents. What is the trouble? Evidently the management of the system needs to be looked into sharply by the rate-payers of the Town.

Now, what we need to do is to induce more people to connect with the water system. To this end offer them, for instance, free water for a period of from three to six months. The more taps we have in use the more revenue will we derive after the expiration of the above term and the water supplied to the patrons will be much purer and fresher.

If elected I will endeavor, with the assistance of the Town Councilors and the other Commissioners, to do all I can to remedy the shortage of revenue caused by lack of patrons, and I will try to keep down all unnecessary expenditures.

## DRAWN LINE AT HUBBY IMPERSONATING SATAN

CHICAGO, Sept. 12.—Dressing in a robe of flaming red, with black trimmings, to represent himself as the Prince of the Region of Brimstone and Sulphur, burning incense and making weird noises to frighten his wife, were acts ascribed to Andrew Blaes in a bill for divorce filed today by Mrs. Blaes. The husband owns \$100,000 worth of property and lives at Glenview Golf Club.

While Mrs. Blaes and her husband have lived in the same house nine years it is asserted that they have occupied separate apartments.

"About eight or nine years ago" says Mrs. Blaes in her bill, "my husband took up the study of hypnotism and occultism and has conducted many experiments in our home.
