may be wound up within a month. There is one obstacle however in the way of such summary closing. The 106 members are each entitled to one thousand dollars as a sessional indemnity if the session lasts longer than thirty days, but can only receive at most three hundred dollars for a session of thirty days or less.

A less than thirty days session would leave each of the members with seven hundred dollars less than he would receive in a long session, but it would leave the Provincial treasury in funds to the amount of \$74,200 more. Very probably the members will find something to occupy their time at Toronto beyond the thirty days limit, but under the Whitney Administration the sessions have hitherto been short, frequently of about two months' duration and sometimes considerably less.

Sir James Whitney is reported as saying that in a shorter time than most persons imagine there will be no legal sale of liquor in rural Ontario. Local option is steadily making increased areas in the Province 'dry' from year to year.

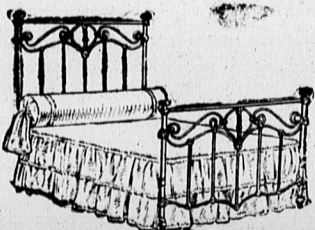

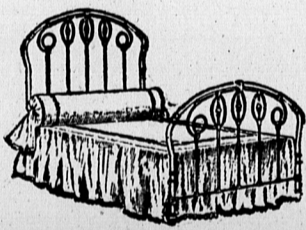
