IRISH "POLICE" HAD NO RIGHT TO TELL TALE

OTTAWA, Dec 15—In despatches from Washington published on Saturday morning, it was alleged that three former members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, each of whom said he had resigned, as a protest against British misrule, appeared before the Committee of One Hundred and gave evidence of raids which they said they had been forced to participate in on orders from British commanders to destroy life and property. One of the men, Caddam, declared he had seen men, women and children dragged from their beds amid showers of bullets to watch their homes burn.

The attention of Sir Hamar Greenwood, Chief Secretary for Ireland, in Lloyd George's cabinet was called to this evidence by Richard H. McDonald, of Ottawa, secretary of the Orange Forward Movement, and the record of these men asked for. This evening Mr. McDonald received a marconigram from the Chief Secretary for Ireland, reading as follows:—

"Have you telegram of the 11th inst. As far as we know no ex-Royal Irish Constabulary men have applied for passports to America to give evidence before Washington committee. There may be ex-Royal Irish Constabulary men living in the United States of America, but none of them have any authority to speak for this splendid and loyal force."
