Ice Breaker Contract Cancelled by Government

OTTAWA, Feb. 7.—The contract for the construction of an ice-breaker, awarded to the Canadian Vickers, Limited, in November last, and signed by the Minister of Marine and Fisheries on Dec. 14, 1921, has been ordered cancelled and the Government. It is stated by officials of the Marine and Fisheries Department, will thereby save over \$1,000,000. Instead of constructing the new vessel, the Government has authorized the purchase of the ice-breaker 'John D. Hazen,' which was sold in an unfinished condition to the Russian Government, but which got no further on her way to Russia than Cherbourg, France, from where she is to be returned to Canada.

No Progress in Search for Taylor's slayer

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Feb. 8.—Officers trying to solve the mystery of the murder of William Taylor, motion picture director, here last Wednesday night, reported tonight that they had made but slight progress in the past 24 hours. The blank wall, which they said unidentified influences appeared to have thrown up between them and the true facts, remained unperforated although the police department and the officers of the sheriff were attempting to make separate breakthroughs into new fields of inquiry. The police continued to concentrate their efforts upon the search for Edward F. Sands, former secretary and butler for Taylor, since Taylor made a charge of August. Mabel Norman and Mary Miles Minter, motion picture actresses, friends of the film director, who have been questioned about the case, remained in seclusion today. Both police and sheriff's investigators did late in the afternoon, further statements had been sought from them.

Policewoman Said Work Degrading

MONCTON, Feb. 7.—Rather than pose as a street walker in order to obtain evidence against women of the underworld and to save her own self respect, Miss Sabina J. Delaney, one of the six women police officers of the Boston force, has resigned her position and at the same time has told a story of police department procedure which has startled this city. Among other things which Miss Delaney charged against the police department was that those in the Back Bay district, where there is immorality, are let alone while unfortunates who frequent other sections of the city are continually hounded by the police. That instead of attempting to prevent crime, Captain Charles T. Keenan of the Bureau of Criminal Investigation, wants nothing but arrests. That policemen are ordered by their superior officer to go into the lowest dives, under the pretense of being frequenters of these places in order not to save unfortunates girls there, but to obtain evidence whereby they may be arrested. That policewomen take complaints to purchase liquor from bootleggers and otherwise act as spies in order to obtain evidence on which the police department may make arrests. That had to resign because she felt that the work of a policewoman was degrading and that her methods were being changed, I think it will be necessary to abolish the women police.

BERLIN, Feb. 8.—The Bolsheviks now admit slaying the former Czar and his family. They published a full account of the end of the Romanoffs, which corresponds generally with the details ascertained during Admiral Kolchak's expedition and later published in the World War World.

Australia Wants Our Athletes

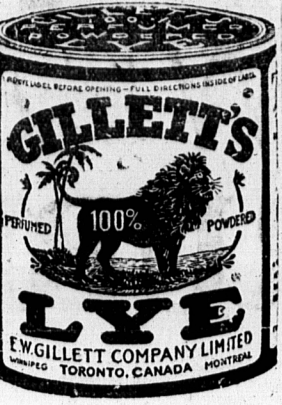
VANCOUVER, B. C., Feb. 6.—Canada should send athletes to Australia and this help to seal the bond of friendship between the two dominions, said O. G. H. Merritt, honorary secretary of the Australian Olympic Council who has arrived here on a business trip. He declared that there was a feeling in the commonwealth that Canada should fall in line with New Zealand, South Africa and the United States and other countries and send her quota of athletes to Australia. Canadian teams would receive a hearty welcome.

To Organize a Great All-Canada Picture Corporation

TORONTO, Feb. 7.—A gigantic all-Canada motion picture corporation is in the making. Ernest Shipman, a producer of Canadian pictures, who formed Canada Photoplays, Limited, with an Alberta charter, three years ago, is authority for the statement that this coming summer will see ten different motion picture production units operating under provincial charters in Canada. Two of these units are already operating—Calgary and Winnipeg—while in Ottawa, Kingston, Toronto and Vancouver, other units are in process of actual organization. In addition some fourteen cities have made application to be included in the list.

To Ask Ottawa for Policy on Repatriation

LONDON, Feb. 7.—An appeal will shortly be made to the new government at Ottawa to lay down a definite policy for the treatment of distressed Canadian soldiers in England. The hardships produced by unemployment in Canada is reproduced on a smaller scale but possibly in more acute degree, among the twenty thousand members of the Canadian Expeditionary Force who are still in England. After an appropriation of \$50,000 had been made available by order in council for repatriation purposes, it was definitely cancelled on November 15th last. The sum of \$15,000 which Sir James Loughhead and Sir Edward Knop had promised to recommend for the repatriation of relief work, was never received, and the relief work must now cease unless the new government reconsider the matter.
