The Morwenna, which is due at Montreal if possible from Prince Edward Island to-day, will make two more trips here before leaving the route. The Cocoona, which was scheduled to leave Montreal Saturday, had not been reported up to last evening, though it is thought she got away on time. The City of Sydney was due to leave Montreal last night for here, and probably did so. With these sailings, and the Sinbad leaving to-morrow, the freight now at P. E. I. for this port will doubtless be cleared up. Together with the above, another ship, just possibly the Bonaventure, now under charter to the Dominion Coal Co., will be put on the route in order to relieve the congestion.—St. John's Exc.

ST. JOHN, Dec. 3.—Edward Trainor of the Marsh Road, received injuries while on work on the Golden Grove Road yesterday afternoon which may result fatally. He was under contract to supply gravel for A. R. C. Clark and Son, and in getting it out in some manner, undermined the bank with the result that the bank fell and buried him. Some of his employees were present at the time of the accident and they set to work and dug the injured man from under the heavy pile of gravel and earth.

It was at once seen that he had been badly injured, and he was removed to the general public hospital for treatment. At the hospital it was found that he had an arm broken and one leg broken, in a couple of places. It is also thought that he is injured internally.
