Carl Hubbell Wins Mound Duel As Giants Defeat Pittsburgh Pirates 3-1

(A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, May 9.—Carl Hubbell and New York Giants today put an abrupt halt to the winning streak of the sensational Darrel (Cy) Blanton, rookie pitching ace of Pittsburgh Pirates...

Blanton, unbeaten in four previous starts and with two shutouts to his credit, was the victim of his own wildness as well as poor support. Cy struck out six, running his total to 36 but issued five passes and yielded eight hits. As that, only one of New York's runs was earned and Blanton matched everything Hubbell had except control. Blanton fanned Jackson with the bases full in the first inning, after passing Terry and Ott, but similar generosity cost a run in the third. Lieber's booming single against the right field wall scored Terry but Ott was caught between third and home on Jackson's grounder.

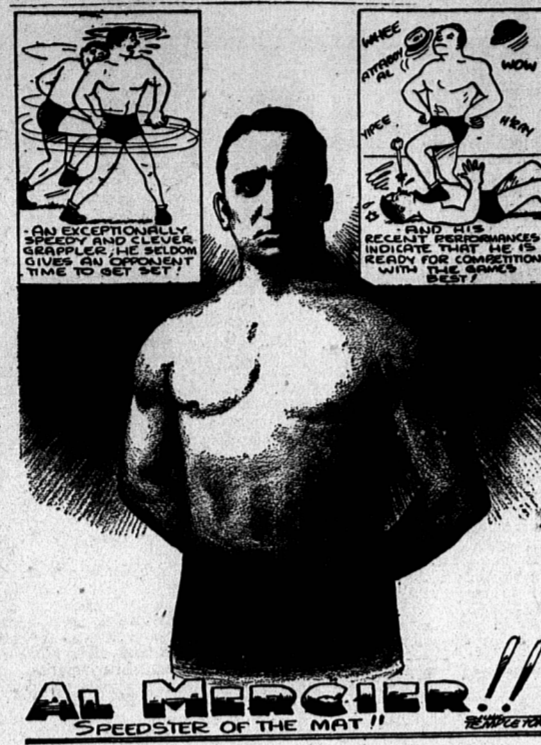

White Sox Home Winning Streak Halted By Red Sox; Browns Defeat Phillies

(A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, May 9.—Chicago White Sox, led from front to back today as Wes Fyrell shut them out until the ninth inning and his Boston mates bested two of their younger pitchers, Les Tietje and Vernon Kennedy, for 15 hits and a 10-1 victory.

The defeat, first in home games this season, ended the Chicagoans' three-day possession of first place on a percentage basis, but they remained a half-game ahead of Cleveland in games won and lost.

Fyrell, the first opposing star-liner pitcher to go the distance at Comiskey Park this year, allowed eight hits and five walks. Twelve Sox players were stranded on the paths.

Manager Joe Cronin, with a six-inning homer with none on and a single, led the Red Sox attack that included besides the homer, a triple and five doubles for a total of 25 bases.

Aided by timely opposition errors and tight pitching of Dick Coffman, St. Louis Browns, today finally broke the back of the season's most persistent losing streak by hanging up a 4-2 victory over Philadelphia.

Coffman, turning in a performance long absent from the Browns' box scores, allowed six well scattered hits. The Browns used the fifth inning to win the game, their first in 11 starts.

Cleveland Indians took a short lead, posting New York Yankees 5-0 in five innings game while Chicago White Sox were losing to Boston. That gave Cleveland first place, .733 to .722.

LIGHTWEIGHT CROWN AT STAKE TONIGHT

Tony Canzoneri In Comeback Attempt Will Battle Lou Ambers For Title.

(By Edward J. Neil) (Associated Press Sports Writer) (A. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, May 9.—Admittedly past his prime, Tony Canzoneri, one of the greatest of the lightweights, still can make history in his division tomorrow night, battling young Lou Ambers of Herkimer, N. Y., 15 rounds for the class championship in Madison Square Garden's final show of the indoor boxing season.

Not since Jack McAuliffe set himself up as lightweight champion half a century ago, starting a line that continued on through such ring heroes as Battling Nelson, Joe Gans, Kid Lavigne, Freddy Welch, Willie Ritchie and Benny Leonard, has a titleholder ever regained his crown once he lost it.

Still young in years but old in the ring with 25 fights behind him, Canzoneri first won the lightweight title from Al Singer on a one-round knockout in Sept. 1909 and held it until Barney Ross beat him in Chicago in June 1923. Wealthy now, a gentleman farmer most of the time on his pleasant acres up near Marlboro, N. Y., Tony has nothing much left to seek from the ring except the fine honor of becoming the first man in the history of the division to regain his throne. He got the chance through the abdication of Barney Ross, who pleaded he could no longer make the weight and preferred anyway to duel Jimmy McLarnin for the welterweight championship.

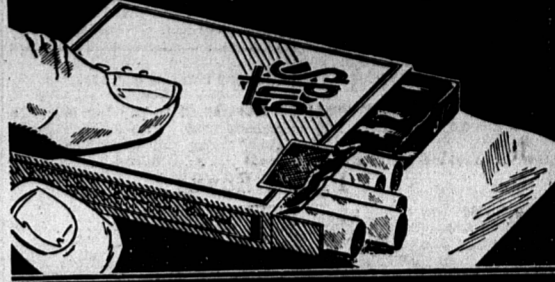
