JAPANESE TRIBUTES TO THE LATE KING EDWARD.

We have before us translations of leading articles from principal Japanese newspapers dealing with the death of King Edward. They are uniform in their tributes to his ability and worth and the beneficent results of his reign, correct in historical facts, discriminating in their eulogy and all deplore his death with a sincerity that is in some of its expressions almost pathetic. The Yomiuri, for instance, says, "We can only express our surprise, mourn bitterly, and lament over the apathy of Heaven." The Chuo dwells on the suddenness of the sad report "which has startled so many millions of people throughout the world. Especially will every one in the Japanese Empire, whether high or low, feel the deepest sorrow over the bereavement which has overtaken the family of the Monarch of the country's valued ally."

The Jiji finds that the loss is irreparable. "Especially now, when the power of the Lords is the great question at issue, perhaps the greatest since the creation of the Constitution, is the need of the conciliatory methods of His Majesty felt. But it is just at this moment that the King has passed to the Beyond, causing an irreparable loss to the British nation. This loss is not limited to the British nation alone; it is likewise a loss to all nations of the world, and more particularly to Japan. Japan feels the sad blow severely, being specially related to Great Britain."

COMMON SENSE AND THE CORONATION OATH.

The excellent Canadian Courier has some sensible reflections on the coronation oath, in which it says "the oath should be amended so as to be positive instead of negative. By stating what a Protestant believes, the King can be relieved of denying what Roman Catholics believe." And why should he be asked to deny on oath the faith of one and only one religious body? There are perhaps one hundred different forms of religious belief among the many millions of people who live under the British flag.

The majority of the people of the British Empire are not Christians at all, for that matter. Buddhists and Mohammedans together are far more numerous in the Empire than are King George's Christian subjects. The King could not retain his crown and be a member of a Presbyterian, or Methodist, or Baptist church. He must be a member and communicant of the Church of England. The law requires it and all the civil authorities of the realm, the Parliament and courts will have it so.

Is it not then enough that the King at his coronation shall solemnly and publicly affirm that he believes the doctrines of the Church of England? He is not asked to swear

As a concluding sample of these many and heartfelt tributes, we quote from The Nippon:

"The report of King Edward's death has come so suddenly and unexpectedly, that one feels almost as if in a dream but unfortunately there is no hope of awakening from the dream. The King has given proof of uncommon natural ability, by the aid of which he paved the way for a reconciliation with France, personally visiting Paris two years after his accession. The Franco-British agreement was arrived at on April 8, 1904. This was a great stroke in the diplomatic world and it has had a far-reaching effect on the peace of the world. Subsequently, on August 31, 1907, the Anglo-Russian agreement was effected. Thus difficult questions which had lasted for centuries were amicably solved. His Majesty's later visits to continental countries helped to maintain existing conditions in the Mediterranean and Atlantic. At the time Germany showed certain displeasure over the King's efforts, but care having been constantly paid by the King to the maintenance of friendly relations between the two countries, everything went on smoothly. However far back we go in history the world has not seen a monarch whose influence upon the world's affairs has been so great as His Majesty's. This great influence having been utilized absolutely for peace, it might even be said that His Majesty was the only monarch who has ever wielded so great an influence."

THE RECENT STRANGE APPEARANCES IN THE SKY.

Some persons have been disposed to laugh at the strange appearances in the sky seen about the time of the passage of Halley's comet between the earth and the sun by various observers in Prince Edward Island, attributing them to over-wrought im-

agination, or the dazzling effect of the sun's rays. But reports of undoubted authenticity from many parts of the world confirm the belief

that something remarkable was really in evidence at the time. The New York Herald tells of a strange spectacle in the southern sky between the hours of twelve and one on Thursday, May 18, and seen at the observatory by the entire staff. There were "curious patches of color that could not be identified with anything before seen, a very peculiar prismatic effect, that could only be explained as a possible effect of the comet."

The observant and thoughtful editor of the Victoria, B. C., Colonist tells of what he personally observed at 6.30 o'clock p.m. on the day in question. He tells that the sun appeared as if covered and surrounded with prismatic colors in motion. He found no difficulty in gazing with open eyes upon the sun at the time. On the following day the sun, seen from the same place appeared as it normally is, and so bright that it could only glance at it for a second. Other observers in British Columbia spoke of moving colors and shadows while an unusual "pillar of light" was observed by many on Sunday evening, May 22.

The crops of Canada last year in wheat, oats and barley called for about 33 millions of bushels of seed grain. Dr. J. W. Robertson estimates that if all this seed had been of the best, the crop of these three kinds of grain would have been greater than it was by 190 million bushels. Perhaps the figures do not give an adequate idea of this amount of grain. It would fill 1,500 miles of grain cars, enough to extend from Halifax to the border of Manitoba. There is an awful waste in sowing poor seed. It is a poor business to sow any but the best. The soil value the cost of tillage and harvesting are the same with bad seed as with the best.
