Charges Sailors Deprived of Votes

CORRESPONDENCE RELATING TO PREPARATION OF LISTS TO BE PRODUCED IN HOUSE

OTTAWA, May 26.—Charges that 10 residents of Port McNicoll, Ont., sailors plying between that harbour and Fort William, were deprived of their votes in the last election, were made in the House of Commons today by A. B. Thompson, Conservative member for Simcoe East. He introduced a motion for the production of all papers relating to the preparation of the voters' lists.

The motion was adopted without opposition. Hon. Hugh Guthrie, Minister of Justice, suggested if the returns, when brought down, supported the charges. Mr. Thompson made, the whole matter would be referred to the Committee on Privileges and Elections. It looked like a conspiracy to prevent these men voting Mr. Guthrie declared.

Spinning and Weaving

Send me your wool to be spun into yarn and wove into blankets. Single yarn is 25 cents and doubled 25 cents per pound. Blanket \$2.25; it takes five lbs. of wool to make a blanket. They will all be laundered unless ordered otherwise. Wool must be well washed and all dirt and burrs picked out. The size of single yarn is medium and double yarn, fine, medium and coarse. Put shipper's name on all parcels and owner's name, address and instructions inside; otherwise we will not be responsible for losses. Send by mail or freight. Freight will be paid on 100 lbs.

Many Canadians Placed On Farms

OTTAWA, May 26—More than 1,500 Canadian families have been placed in permanent farm settlements and more than 7,000 single men, likewise Canadians, have been placed in farm employment during the present year.

This result of co-ordinated effort by the Dominion Government and the colonization departments of the Canadian railways is announced following a conference of the interests involved called by Hon. W. A. Gordon, Minister of Immigration.

This is the first time that the colonization activities of the railways and the Government have taken the form of a co-ordinated effort in the placing of Canadians in productive work on the land. This colonization work is being accomplished without additional expenditure of public money.

Action along this line was agreed upon at a conference of the Minister of Immigration and Colonization, the president of the Canadian Pacific Railway and the president of the Canadian National Railways in January last when it was decided to concentrate for the present upon finding places on farms for persons already in Canada who were willing and able to undertake farm operation or farm labor.

It was the experience of those engaged in this work that under present conditions there are considerable numbers of persons in Canada, both families and individuals, who welcomed an opportunity to earn a subsistence on the land, and steps are being taken to co-ordinate the efforts of the colonization departments of the railways and the department of immigration and colonization in promoting this type of settlement. Every effort will be made to satisfactorily locate within the province in which they are now living, families at present resident in cities who would welcome an opportunity to ensure their own maintenance on the land.

FARM NOTES

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, GRADES FOR CABBAGE RECOMMENDED BY THE FRUIT BRANCH

No. 1 shall consist of heads of cabbage which are of similar type, reasonably firm and well trimmed; not withered or burst; free from soft rot and seed stems, and free from damage caused by discoloration, freezing, disease, insects or mechanical or other means.

In order to allow for variations incident to proper grading and handling, not more than 10% by weight of any lot may be below the requirements of the grade but not more than 1-5 of this tolerance, or 2% may be affected with decay.

No. 2 shall consist of heads of cabbage which do not meet the requirements of the foregoing grade.

Definition of Terms

"Similar type" means that the lot must be of the pointed, flat, savoy or red type as the case may be.

"Reasonably firm" means that the heads yield slightly to pressure, but are not soft.

"Well trimmed" means that all outer leaves injured by worm, disease or other means are removed and the stem not longer than 1/2 inch.

"Seed stems" means heads which have seed stalks showing or where the formation of the seed stalk is plainly indicated.

"Free from damage" means that the heads shall not be injured to an extent readily apparent upon examination.

Containers

Crates of the following inside dimensions are recommended as suitable for cabbage:
