THE JOURNAL AND THE SCOTT ACT.

The erratic Summerside Journal discusses the proposed repeal of the Scott Act. The article is not altogether intelligible, and is contradictory. It repeats that the Town Council and people of Summerside are "absolutely satisfied" with the way the law has been enforced, and says it has produced a large revenue, but calls for a proper enforcement of it, whatever that may mean.

"Let the Scott Act which no further amendments can be added be properly enforced and the fines from such enforcement be applied to the local needs of the town and country and it will be found much more efficacious in curtailing the sale of poisonous liquors, which will be driven out from decent, respectable hotels into low dives, the proprietors of which will be unable to pay any fines against them and will consequently have to go to jail to be a further charge on the community, whereas with the Scott Act enforced, it will mean good roads and sidewalks, more light, we have enough police protection, but there are a number of improvements that the liquor sellers of the town provide for the people of this town, that they will have to assess themselves for, if the Scott Act is repealed in this county on the first of February."

There are few men who even when incapacitated to walk straight can't talk straighter than that. As a specimen of reasoning it is a reflection upon the intelligence of the Journal's readers. There are intelligent men who do not believe in prohibition of the liquor traffic and these we feel quite sure will not feel complimented by the utterly meaningless twaddle in which the Journal attempts to set forth their views.

We believe the large majority of the people of Prince County desire the abolition of the liquor traffic in their midst, and failing that, that its evils shall be as much restricted as possible. They believe that the Prohibitory Law, which has been tried and its good effects demonstrated will be a much more effective instrument to that end than the Scott Act has been. They are therefore proceeding in a common sense way to get rid of a rather ineffective instrument in order that a better one may take its place. To that end they will go to the polls a week hence and vote against the Scott Act.

Three times since confederation a prominent Canadian statesman has died on the other side of the Atlantic. Sir George E. Cartier died in London in May 1873. Sir John Thompson died at Windsor Castle in December 1894 and Hon. Raymond Prefontaine died in Paris recently. Sir George Cartier's remains were sent home in an ordinary passenger steamer. It is due to the greater importance and prominence of Canada in more recent years that a war vessel was sent in each case to bring home the bodies of Sir John Thompson and Hon. Mr. Prefontaine.
