THE prope ty of the late George Peake, corner of Euston and Schools Streets has been purchased by Archibald McLean of R. F. Mutch and Co. for \$2710.

BISHOP Courtney will spend August in Cape Breton, and will visit the parishes of Arichat, Baddeck, Lunenburg, the Sydneys, Port Morien and Glace Bay.

OVER two hundred passengers went from the city by the special yesterday to the Gorge town races and many more joined along the line. There were also a large number of visitors from Souris and other parts of King's County.

Mr. and Mrs. Murdock McLeod and family are enjoying the beauties of P. E. Island on a driving tour. Mrs. E. Dunlap and Miss Dunlap left yesterday to visit friends in Charlottetown and Souris, P. E. I.—Moncton Times.

AN enthusiastic convention of Liberal Conservative electors of Georgetown district was held yesterday. The nominations for next provincial election were Archibald J. McDonald for Councilman and J. A. Mathieon for Assemblyman. The present representatives are A. J. McDonald and Hon. Daniel Gordon.

Hon. H. R. Emmerson arrived in the city yesterday afternoon from his home in Dorchester and is at the Royal. Mr. Emmerson, when asked about the situation at Ottawa, consequent on the resignation of Hon. A. G. Blair from the cabinet, said he had nothing to say on the matter. He will return to Dorchester today.—S. John's Telegraph.

A. B. WARBURTON, one of the leading liberal politicians of Charlottetown was in the city yesterday. Mr. Warburton says that on Prince Edward Island the people hardly know what to think of Blair's resignation. Although there had been rumors for some days previous to the announcement, these had not reached the island, and Mr. Blair's action came as a big surprise. The Sacrifice of the Shannon is a new book by W. Albert Hickman, which will no doubt have a very large sale in this section of the Maritime Provinces. The scene is laid in Pictou, the Straits of Northumberland and Gulf of St. Lawrence. The stirring incidents of the plot occur on board of or have to do with two ice-breaking winter steamers, the Shannon and Liffey, which correspond very closely with the Stanley and Minto. Indeed so strong is the local color that the book has as a frontispiece the portrait of a real live Pictou girl, the heroine of the story, while in another of the illustrations Capt. Finlayson is shown as the captain of the Liffey. The story is well told, with sustained interest from first to last, and some pages of its descriptive work are admirable. The author made a special study of winter navigation and wrote a portion of the novel on board the Minto. He makes acknowledgement of his indebtedness to the officers of that steamer. A pretty love story runs through the plot, and one must go far to find a more admirable pair of lovers than David Wilson and Miss McMichael. William Briggs & Co. of Toronto are the publishers.

THE Seventeenth session of the Summer School opened at Chatham on the evening of Monday July 20th, under the patronage of the Lieutenant-Governor and the local government. The school has now fully established itself in popular favour and has the endorsement and the recognition of the educational authorities of all the Atlantic provinces as being a valuable aid in educational work. While affording to teachers especially, a means of obtaining, at a low cost needed recreation and change as well as opportunity in a pleasant way for an interchange of ideas, it seeks, through the aid of the best educational talent in the province, and by the bringing of distinguished educationalists from abroad, to point out and to practically illustrate the methods by which, in literature as well as in nature study, the best results are to be obtained. The work at Chatham is being conducted along the same lines as they have found to work satisfactorily at other places. The morning hours are devoted to classwork, the afternoons alternately to laboratory and field work, and the evenings to lectures of a more popular character. These will this year include two of the celebrated Bickmore lectures, one upon Southern California and the Yosemite, the other on the Hawaiian Islands, prepared under the direction of the New York State Board of Education, and illustrated by large collections of the finest coloured lantern views; also a lecture on the Microscope in Biology, illustrating by specially prepared views the structure of the minutest forms of life. Blow-pipe work by the beautiful plaster-tablet method will be carried on as usual, as will the practical determination of ordinary minerals and rocks by physical methods, a course which was inaugurated last year at St. Stephen, and proved to be very attractive to those entering upon it. The name and fame of Miss Robinson will be sufficient guarantee of the worth and interest of the lectures in English literature. Two all-day excursions will be given, one probably up the beautiful Miramichi river, the other to points on the shores of Miramichi Bay.
