The following clipping from a Sackville exchange will be interesting here as Mrs. Lucas and Mr. Howard referred to are both natives of this Province. At a recent meeting of the W. M. S. Mrs. Lucas gave an interesting address on "The World in Boston." Much regret was expressed at the departing of Mrs. (Rev.) Rogers, and she was presented with valuable gifts in appreciation of her work. Rev. S. Howard, the new pastor, and his family arrived on the 6th inst. A Sackville correspondent to the St. John Globe says: "If we reckon from the time of the First Methodist church in Sackville, built in the nearest corner of the Tingley burial ground, about three-quarters of a mile northward from Crane's Corner, the second Methodist church, indeed, erected in Canada, that in Point de Hute being the first, Methodism has had a corporate existence in this place and for one hundred and twenty-one years and the first minister was James Mann, a native of New York who with Thomas Olivant was stationed in St. John in 1801. The opening sermon was preached by William Grandin, who hailed from New Jersey and was also well known in St. John in the early days of Methodism. The above mentioned church building is generally believed to have been moved to Upper Sackville to serve as a place of worship when a second church was built at the corner on the site of the Music Hall. When there also in the course of time it was supplanted, it is said to have been sold and converted into a barn and it is not improbable that it may be still in existence.

The S. M. S. Bremen which recently visited in this port, is now in Montreal. Speaking of her arrival a Montreal exchange says: The Bremen which is here for the second time, the first occasion being in August 1907, is commanded by Captain Coette, a most capable and courteous naval officer and a strict disciplinarian. Originally belonging to the German West Indian cruiser squadron which patrols the Atlantic coast from Labrador to South America, the Bremen carrying thirty guns of varying calibre is considered to be one of the foremost German fighting ships of her size. Her length over all is 377 feet which she carries a complement of more than 400 officers and men. During the vessel's stay here, which is understood to be until August 3, a series of fetes and entertainments have been arranged for both officers and men by the Teutonic Club of Montreal.
