European Purchases Of American Goods May Sag Further

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19 — (AP)—European purchases of American goods, which sagged 16 per cent in June, may be further reduced by trade concessions to Britain at the Anglo-American dollar conference here, American officials predicted today.
The Commerce Department reported that hard-pressed England, now suffering an economic crisis, was the only major European power to increase its buying from the U. S. in June. Her purchases, totalled \$98,800,000 for the month, \$5,200,000 more than in May.
Most other countries reduced their American purchases, resulting in the first sizable post-war decline of United States exports.
Britain since has announced a \$500,000,000 cut in imports for the rest of this year, chiefly from the United States, and likely will emerge from the talks with a green light to increase her trade with the Dominions at the expense of purchases of American goods.

Quebec Police Reveal Story Of Fatal Quarrel

(By The Canadian Press) RIMOUSKI, Que., Aug. 19 — Police laid a formal charge of murder against "Hell-driver" Jimmy Hazlitt of Texas and Oklahoma today outgrowth of a circus grounds scuffle last Sunday during which Edward Dolron received injuries from which he died.
It was announced that Hazlitt, 32-year-old circus man who leads a troop of automobile "death drivers" would appear in court for preliminary hearing before Judge Aimee Caron next Monday.
Hazlitt, with no permanent address but a native of Palestine, Texas, was held in jail here in this Gaspe town where there were angry mutterings among the populace in connection with the death of the 26-year-old Dolron, an electrician from St. Florence, Que., who went to see the circus Sunday at night by Causpepa, 10 miles north of Matapedia, Que.
Hazlitt's wife, said to have been a central figure in the altercation between the Dolrons, was that Dolron wanted to take Mrs. Hazlitt's photograph and she objected, sought out her husband finally, and told him Dolron was bothering her. At that, so police said, Hazlitt knocked the St. Florence man down and kicked him about the head and body.
An angry crowd gathered and threatened the American circus impresario but before harm could be done to him police took him under their protection as an important witness, held in protective custody. Last night a coroner's jury found him criminally responsible for Dolron's death.
At that time—the inquest was held here—the townspeople showed their feelings when, to the number of about 800 they gathered in muttering groups outside the courtroom but dispersed without demonstration when informed of the verdict.
Testimony at the inquest was to the effect Dolron had been drinking. Mrs. Hazlitt told Dolron to go away, saying she was married.
"I'm married, too, so it doesn't matter," said Dolron.

The woman left the gate at an intermission but Dolron kept bothering her and she went for her husband who told Dolron to keep away. Dolron continued to follow the Hazlitts and said something in French after which Hazlitt struck him in the face and the electrician fell, apparently striking the back of his head or neck on a stone.

Have Homeless Tots For Babyless Homes

WINNIPEG, Aug. 19 — (CP) — If you want to adopt a baby in Manitoba your chances of getting the traditional blue-eyed girl or brown-haired boy are slim, says Sidney McArton, assistant director of the welfare branch of the province's health department. There are 230 applications on file and only about 200 babies are adopted each year, half of them in the Greater Winnipeg area.
It's a happy job, matching homeless babies with babyless homes, says McArton. Girls are in greatest demand because "the wife thinks it would be easier to bring up a girl" and because she usually wants a little girl as a companion for herself.
Parents want quite young babies to bring up as their own from the beginning. Doctors, psychiatrists and social workers "match" the baby to the new parents' appearance, color of eyes and hair, physique, religion and other matters are considered.
"If the baby comes from a father and mother with musical ability we try to find a home where music is appreciated. Background may be a questionable factor in the ability a child develops but at least we give it every chance," says Miriam Ferns, one of the three adoption workers.
"As for there being a black market in babies — where there is trafficking in babies for money — I'd say it just doesn't exist in Manitoba."

DETROIT, Aug. 19 — (AP) — General manager Billy Evans of the Detroit Tigers said today that manager Steve O'Neill had denied to him a report that he would place Joe Cronin as manager of Boston Red Sox next season.
The Boston Post said in a copyrighted story that O'Neill would take over Cronin's managerial duties and that the Red Sox skipper would succeed the ailing Eddie Collins as general manager of the Boston Club.
In St. Louis, Cronin described the report as a "lot of bunk."

Excess Profits Tax Act Standard Profits Claims NOTICE

Recent amendments to the above Act provide that all standard profits claims must be filed with the Department of National Revenue before 1st September, 1947.

All applications are required to be in such form and contain such information as may be prescribed by the Minister and the Minister may reject an application that is not made in such form or that does not contain such information.

The prescribed forms (S.P.1) are available at all District Income Tax offices of the Dominion Government.

All pertinent information required on the form must be included or attached thereto in schedule form. Tentative or incomplete forms or those filed after 31st August, 1947, will not be accepted.
