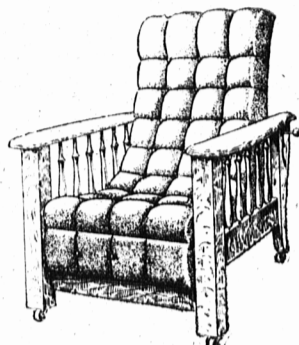

week. Three new pens started of white Leghorns is 5th, with 5 eggs and J. B. Millman's pen of Barred Rocks is 6th, with 4 eggs. Up to the present only one Bacerd Rock pullet has started laying. The standing of the pens to date is as follows:

White Leghorns led for the week with 25 eggs; Mr. William Neale's pen of White Leghorns was 2nd, with 12 eggs; The Experimental Station's pen of White Leghorns No. 19, was 3rd, with 8 eggs; and Mrs. F. Dingwell's pen of White Leghorns tied with Mr. F. W. pen

of white Leghorns is 5th, with 5 eggs and J. B. Millman's pen of Barred Rocks is 6th, with 4 eggs. Up to the present only one Bacerd Rock pullet has started laying. The standing of the pens to date is as follows:
